

Box 2 In the Name of God Amens. I know all men that  
110 8 Carroll Cleland Hamilton knowing the uncertainty of life do make  
this my last Will and Testament. I do give and bequeath to my  
beloved Brother James Hamilton all my Estates real and personal  
trust for my beloved Sister Elizabeth Lynch Prolcaw (after the payment  
of the legacies hereinafter devised) during her natural life and at  
her death to be equally divided among her daughters. Should she how-  
ever die before her Sons are educated then the income of my said property  
is to be divided into four equal parts and a part assigned to each of her  
Sons Samuel and Charles Kuhn to be expended under the special  
direction of my Executor in their Education until the same shall be  
completed. After which the same to revert to my Nieces Hannah and  
Alice Prolcaw. In consequence of the long and faithful and affectionate  
devotion of Sarah Hart to me from the period of my infancy I do hereby charge  
my Estate with the payment of an annuity to her of One Hundred Dollars  
per Annum as a token of my sincere gratitude and regard. And whereas  
Catharine Nugent during my present illness has displayed the kindest attention  
and most affectionate devotion I do hereby bequeath to her the sum of One hundred  
Dollars which I do hereby direct my Executor to pay over to her as soon after my  
death as may be convenient. I do hereby empower upony my Executor to purchase  
out of the income of my Estate a Gold Watch for my Nephew James Hamilton  
Prolcaw as a small token of the love I bear him. I regret that my estate is not  
sufficiently large to authorize such a division of it as would afford him a  
more substantial proof of my affection. But James signed from his bed

and most affectionate devotion I do hereby bequeath to her the sum of One thousand  
Dollars which I do hereby direct my Executor to pay over to her as soon after my  
death as may be convenient. I do hereby enjoin upon my Executor to withdraw  
out of the second of my Estate a Gold Watch for my Nephew James Hamilton  
Proelcan as a small token of the love I bear him. I regret that my estate is not  
sufficiently large to authorise such a division of it as would afford him a  
more substantial proof of my affection. But I am sure from its kindred and  
from the situation of his good mother and sisters he will perceive the  
and justice of the bequest I have made in their favor without any loss  
the regard and devoted attachment I have always felt for him.

desire that a ring or brooch whichever they prefer should be purchased for  
James Heyward Squibb and Elizabeth Hamilton, but I particularly request  
that they may not be mourning rings or brooches or those with hair, but

No 9 Parish in the State of South Carolina, being by the mercy of Almighty  
God, in good Health and of sound and disposing memory and mind  
do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form  
following to wit. Imprimis I will and direct my just debts and  
funeral expenses to be first paid out of my Estate real and personal.  
Item I give devise and bequeath all that Tract of Land measuring
