

The last Will and Testament of Harriott Palmer of St. James Parish
South Carolina. - 1st It is my wish that my Debts be paid before my property
is divided - 2nd I give and bequeath to my Nephew Edward Gordon Palmer
his Bonds which I now hold or may have in my possession at the time of my
Decease, also whatever Interest may be due on them, to him & his heirs forever -
3rd - I give and bequeath to my Sister Rebecca Verree, Three hundred Dollars
to purchase a Gold Watch or whatever she may desire - That triple to her to
to bear in mind our ever sincere Love and affection - 4th I desire that my
Executors do purchase one best Gold Watch with suitable chain (Gold) and
present to my affectionate Niece Harriott Serman Palmer, to wear by her, that
she may ever bear in mind that the Donor watched over her with a Parents care,
affection, and solicitude - 5th To my esteemed friend Rebecca Allston Serman,
I bequeath One hundred Dollars to purchase a mourning ring and pin - 6th To my
Nieces Allston Cahusac, and Mary Rebecca Serman - I bequeath each Three
hundred Dollars to be paid them when they arrive at the age of Eighteen, or day
of Marriage without Interest, but should they not receive the Legacies at the
time mentioned they then will be entitled to Interest till paid - 7th As it is
my wish to Equalize my Sons Bonds which each are to accept of, with whatever
Interest may be due on them at the time of my decease, I give and bequeath to
my Son J. S. Palmer the following Negroes and their future increase to him
and his Heirs forever - Hester, Myrtilla, Jacob, Binca, Rachel, Catty, Cumber,
Billy, Dizzy, Primm, Delia, Simla - 8th To my Son J. S. Palmer, I give my
Carpenter Bob, in consideration of my having lived with him since his coming
of age - 9th The residue of my estate I give to my Son J. S. Palmer

is divided - 2nd I give and bequeath to my Nephew Edward Gordon Palmer
his Bonds which I now hold or may have in my possession at the time of my
Decease, also whatever Interest may be due on them, to him & his heirs forever -
3rd - I give and bequeath to my Sister Rebecca Warner, Three hundred Dollars

I bequeath One hundred Dollars to purchase a mourning ring and pin - 6th - To my
Nieces Allston Cahusac, and Mary Rebecca Serman - I bequeath each Three
hundred Dollars to be paid them when they arrive at the age of Eighteen, or day
of Marriage without Interest, but should they not receive the Legacies at the
time mentioned they then will be intitled to Interest till paid - 7th - As it is
my wish to Equalize my Sons Bonds which each are to accept of with whatever
Interest may be due on them at the time of my decease, I give and bequeath to
my Son S. S. Palmer the following Negroes and their future increase to him
and his Heirs forever - Hester, Myrtilla, Jacob, Binca, Rachel, Caty, Cuzsee,
Billy, Peggy, Primus, Delia, Timb - 8th - To my Son S. S. Palmer, I give my
Carpenter Bob, in consideration of my having lived with him since his coming
of age - 9th - The residue of my property I give and bequeath to my Sons S. S. Palmer,
and P. S. Palmer, share and share alike, to them and their Heirs forever.

sition mind and memory and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs
whilst I have strength and capacity so to do, do make and publish this my
last Will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all former Wills
by me at any time heretofore made - And first and principally I commit my
Soul into the hands of my Creator who gave it, and my body to the Earth to be
interred at the discretion of my Executors herein after named. And as to such
worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to intrust me I do dispose of the
same as follows - I first give and bequeath to my Niece Emily M. Trott
the sum of Four hundred dollars to be paid in the first instance from the amount
which may be collected from a Note due me by John M. Millan for Eight
Hundred dollars, but should the said John M. Millan not pay up the amount
of said Note with
