 Town in South Carolina (but late of the County for Sheriff (Just Bindon) being now
 in Reasonable Health but considering the Decadence of Age & Mortality, now among
 us & being Willing to Dispose & Set my Self in Order to Raille, the Divine Pleasure &
 make & Declare this to be my Last Will, I do hereby Bequeath for mercy of my Creator
 Whom I have often Offended but Still hope through his Infinite Mercy & the Merits
 of Death & of Jesus of my dear Jesus Christ I shall Enjoy him in Heaven: I Bequeath my
 Funerall to be private.

I Do (with all Sincerity) acknowledge, I am justly Indebted to severall persons in Great
 Britain & by their Impatience have been Obliged to come to this Province to procure Security for
 my Self & Dear Wife who always has been & Still is my Portus in my Good & Ill fortunes
 I have Done my best Endeavours to retrieve my Misfortunes but if it please God I should
 Lay up money to pay Every one to whom I am Indebted this whole Demand I hope they will
 accept a Composition, that they will not Oppose my Widow on Whose Justice I Place
 that Confidence, that I Do hereby Give Devise & Bequeath unto my Dear & Beloving
 Wife Ann Hargrave all my Estate both Real & Personal whatsoever that I shall Die
 possessed of or Entitled unto either in this Province or Else Where having that Confidence
 she will be able to manage as I have always Intended so as to Wrong no body of their Just Due
 it is to be my Power to Give them but I Do hereby make & Ordain my said Wife my
 Executrix Entirely Begging the kind Assistance of my friends in Adjusting Such of
 my Affairs as I may have left unfinished, In Witness whereof I have to
 this my Last Will & Testament, Set my hand & Seal the 28th day of July 1732
