Whereas Hugh Demand late belonging to his Majesty's Ship Fox in this Harbor
Drowned lately upon Intertide having whilst he lived and at the time of his Death
Quintessence Goods Rights and Credits within the Province aforesaid by means whereof
His full Disposition and power of Granting the Administration of all and singular
the Goods Rights and Credits of the said Hugh Demand Drowned and also the
and the Accounts Calculations and Particulars of the said Administration and a
true Description of the same to me is manifestly known to belong I Desiring that the
Goods Rights and Credits of the said Drowned may be well and truly Administered
Governed and Disposed of Do hereby Grant unto the said Thomas Weaver in
whose Fidelity in this behalf I have much Confidence full power by the Town of these
Privileges to Administer the Goods Rights and Credits of the said Drowned whilst
him in his Lifetime and at the time of his Death did belong and to sell Collocate
Buy or sell and Dispose the same and to pay the Debts in which the Drowned is
Engaged before the said Goods Rights and Credits will be paid according to
their rate and Order of Law being first sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty
God to make a true and perfect Inventory thereof and to exhibit the same into the
Court of the said Charles Towne in Order to be presented at or before the First day of
now next ensuing and to render a true and just Account Calculations and Particulars
of the said Administration when thereunto required And I do Ordain Depute
Constitute You the said Thomas Weaver Administrator of all and singular
the Goods Rights and Credits of the said Drowned.

to be returned under your Hands or any three or four of you into the Court of the said
Charles Towne in Order to be presented at or before the first day of May now next ensuing.
