The Condition of this Obligation is that that if the aforesaid Hugh Evans his heirs Executors do and shall lawfully and truly pay observe perform fulfill and keep a hand singular the Conditions Grants Payments Claims Demands Conditions and Agreements to whatsoever whether the great and behalf of him the said Hugh Evans his heirs Executors do and shall lawfully and truly observe perform fulfill and keep Comprise or mentioned in any of the Bills of Sale in Mortgage of two Negroes named Tom and Louis bearing date with these presents and so expressed to be made for and in consideration of One hundred and twenty pounds current money of the Province of South Carolina by the aforesaid Hugh Evans unto the said Mungo Walsh and that in and by all things and according to the true intent and meaning of the said Bills of Sale and Mortgage here in expressed Then this present Obligation is good and

Letters of Admin to William Elliot granted to Elizabeth
