I hold all men by these presents That I Hugh Evans of Charleston in the Province of South Carolina Taylor for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and ten pounds Currant money of the said Province to me in hand paid at and before the making and delivery of the 5. presents by Mungo Welsh of the same place Merchant the receipt whereof I the said Hugh Evans do here by act and take have Bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Mungo Welsh One Negro Slave boy named Tom and One Negro Slave woman named the said Hugh Evans to have and to hold the above bargain and sold Negro Slave unto the said Mungo Welsh his heirs and assigns who and their proper heirs and assigns the said two Negro Slaves unto the said Mungo Welsh his heirs and assigns forever and of all persons who knowe Shall & Will WARRANT request and Demand by the said presents forever PROVIDED always and it is further Intend and meaning of these presents that if the said Hugh Evans my heirs and assigns or either of them hereafter shall pay or Cause to be paid unto the said Mungo Welsh his heirs and assigns or assigns the agreed sum of One hundred and ten pounds Currant money aforesaid with lawful Interest thereunto On the seven twentieth day of August next ensuing the day of the date of these presents within any day whereat a demand shall be made Wherein this Bill of Sale Mortgage to be void of no Effect or else to be and remain in full force and Virtue But if default shall be made in the payment of the said principal money and Interest or either of them within the time aforesaid then it shall and may be lawful
