manner and form following, that is to say principally and first
of all, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who
gave it and my Body to earth to be buried in a respectable Christian man-
ner, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to
give me and bequeath of the same in the following manner and form that is to say first
I give and bequeath unto my Beloved wife Cath-
arine Devoes Rembert, a negro Boy named Tommy, one Horse and my
riding vehicle to will and dispose of as she may think proper. It is my
wish that the whole remainder of my property shall be kept together for
the support of my wife & children and when the first child becomes
of age or is married, I wish the property so left to be equally divided
between all of my children, the child so marrying or becoming of age to
take his or her proportion and the remainder of the other childrens property
to go equally for the support of my wife and the remainder of the chil-
dren, each one taking their proportion at the time of their arriving at
the age of twenty one or that they may get married and the other chil-
drens proportion to be kept as above for the support of my family, until
the last one shall be married or arrive at the age of twenty one, But
no part of the property whether personal Real or whatsoever kind or nature
is to be subject to the debt, incumbrances or disposal of either of the above
children or any Husband they may marry. Should either of my chil-
dren die not leave issue I wish that the

to go equally for the support of my wife and the remainder of the chil-
-dren, each one taking their proportion at the time of their arriving at
the age of twenty one or that they may get married and the other chil-
-dren's proportion to be kept as above for the support of my family, until
the last one shall be married or arrive at the age of twenty one, But

-dren die not leaving Lawful Heir of their Body, the property or portion
of such child shall return to my surviving children to be equally divided
among them. And Lastly I the said Isaac Rembert do nominate
and appoint my Father in Law M^r Samuel Hamlin, my friends George
H. McDowall and William B. McDowall all of St Thomas's Parish
my Executors to this my last Will and Testament, ^{revoke} ~~revoking~~ ^{making} ~~making~~
and all and every other Will or Wills at any time heretofore by me made
and do declare this to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness

make this twentieth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand eight
hundred and thirty eight and in the sixty second year of American Independence.

In the first place, I resign myself my soul to God who gave it, re-

discretion of my Executors hereinafter named.

Item, I request and desire that all my funeral expenses and
just debts be paid by my said Executors. Whereas, by the last Will
and Testament of my late Husband Samuel Dickson of the State and
District aforesaid, I am empowered absolutely to dispose of one third
of his whole estate, I do hereby give and bequeath to each and every of
my four eldest children, to wit, Ann Bell Alexander Nelson Bell,
William Bell and Jane Knox, one hundred dollars to be paid
first out of my said third.

Item I give and bequeath all my bedding, bed clothes and
wearing apparel to my daughter Ann Bell and Jane Knox to
be equally divided between them.
