In the Name of God Amen! I Isabella Rolando of this City, Charleston S.C. widow of Henry Rolando deceased, planter, in the Island of Cuba, being of sound mind memory and understanding, do hereby and in exercise of the power and authority, in me vested by and in the last Will and Testament of the said Henry Rolando, and by force and in virtue of all and every the Powers & powers, authority & authorities in me being and enabling me to make this my last Will & Testament in the following manner, that is to say: After payment of all my funeral expenses and the expense of proving this my Will, Doctors bill &c. I give and devise unto my son Charles Henry, all the proceeds arising from the sale of all my negroes in Charleston, the carriage & horse, all the household furniture of which I may die possessed & all the articles of silver &c. & unto his heirs & assigns forever. Unto my second son Francis Gregory, I give & bequeath my house & lot in Cumberland Street No. ... & unto his heirs and assigns forever. And unto my Daughter M^{rs} Isabella J. Payne, I give & bequeath my house and lot in Trade Street No. ... for her whole & sole use, both in law and principal, not subject to any control but her own unless it be necessary to give it to her as a trust estate and in that case, the deed must be drawn & executed and a trustee appointed, it then must be so worded, that she may Will it to whom she pleases. If after a fair valuation of the respective portions of my three Children, that portion, which I have above allotted to my daughter, by the house and lot in Trade Street, be of greater value than the portions given

herein to my two son likewise separately, the difference must be made up to my
 sons from my estate in the Island of Cuba, it being my determination that
 all my children shall share alike and that neither one shall have more
 than an other. The residue of said property, in the said island, after
 my daughter's patrimony (left to her by her Father's last Will and Testament)
 shall have been paid & the difference made up to my sons as above ~~directed~~
 directed, must be equally divided between my three children Charles
 Francis G. and Isabella Jane, the portion of the latter being ar-
 ranged precisely as the house in Tradd Street & subjects to the same res-
 trictions, interest as well as principal. And I do hereby nominate
 constitute and appoint my daughter M^{rs} Isabella J. Payne my sole Execu-
 cutrix of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have here-
 unto set my hand and seal this 28th day of December in the year of Our
 Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two. Isabella Rolando / S S /
