the same which was conveyed to me by Milward Pogson, the same to be in the service
of my Husband Ben Reid during the term of his natural life, and at his death, the same
shall be given to Sarah Ann Reid, and in case of the death of Sarah Ann Reid without
leaving issue, the ^{same} shall be given to her Mother Mariah Reid, if however the said Sarah
Ann Reid has children the property shall be for the benefit of her children for ever.
I give and bequeath to Sarah Jenkins & Sarah Jackson my servant girl Hetty &
her child, unto them the said Sarah Jenkins and Sarah Jackson their heirs
Executors and administrators, in trust nevertheless for the use Benefit & behoof
of my Husband Ben Reid, a man of color, and in case he shall marry, then the
above Hetty with her child, shall be permitted to work and pay by instalments into
the hands of Messrs Richard E. Dereef and Peter B. Matthews (whom I appoint as my
lawful Executors) the sum of three hundred dollars \$300, which sum after being
paid into the hands of said Richard E. Dereef & Peter B. Matthews by said Hetty with
her child, I will and desire that the said sum of three hundred dollars thus paid, shall
be divided between the above Sarah Jenkins and Sarah Jackson, each to have one hun-
dred and fifty dollars a part. The said servant Hetty and her child shall after
the payment of the above sum be considered, as free and beyond any control by
said Sarah Jenkins and Sarah Jackson, provided however the above slave Hetty
shall have children before the above sum of three hundred dollars is fully paid.

her child, I will and desire that the said sum of three hundred dollars thus paid, shall be divided between the above Sarah Jenkins and Sarah Jackson, each to have one hundred and fifty dollars a part. The said servant Hetty and her child shall after the payment of the above sum be considered, as free and try on a any control by said Sarah Jenkins and Sarah Jackson, provided however the above slave Hetty shall have children before the above sum of three hundred dollars is fully paid said children shall be for the use of my sisters children. - I give and bequeath to my sisters son Edward Jackson the sum of two hundred dollars to be deposited in the hands of Richard E. Darsee and Peter B. Matthews for safe keeping, until he shall arrive at the age of Twenty one years, at which time the same shall be given to him and should he die before that time, the same shall be given to his sister Jane Jackson. And as I have adopted Edward Jackson (my sisters son) as my child, I commend him to the care of my beloved Husband and the Union Sisters of Charity Society of which I am a member. I give and bequeath to Jane Jackson a $\frac{1}{2}$ dozen large table spoons. I also give and bequeath to Sarah Ann Reid my feather bed and one spread the remainder of my bed and bedding. I do give and bequeath to my Husband and daughter and all else attached to my chamber. I desire that one Marseille spread, one patch quilt $\frac{1}{2}$ dozen damask napkins $\frac{1}{2}$ dozen Madras handkerchiefs, one damask table cloth $\frac{1}{2}$ dozen breakfast cups & $\frac{1}{2}$ dozen china plates be given to Sarah Jackson. I also desire that $\frac{1}{2}$ dozen China cups and $\frac{1}{2}$ dozen plates be given to Sarah Jackson. Lastly, as to all the rest of my goods and chattels, front Room furniture &c I give and bequeath to my husband Ben Reid. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand.

Before I proceed to dispose of my Estate, it is ^{to} be understood, that my beloved daughters Elizabeth S. Smith, Martha Gregorie and Harriet Butler Coffin have already received of me their portion of my Negroes; as the deeds which I have executed for that purpose will show. I give and bequeathe to my beloved daughter Martha Gregorie, all my plantation in St Peters, which I bought of James Shoolbred Esq^r for and during her natural life; and after her decease to her children or issue; to vest at her decease in the said issue absolutely, as if they took by intestacy. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Harriet Butler Coffin my plantation on the Euhaw in St Lukes Parish to her and her heirs forever. I give and bequeathe to my Son James S. Macpherson
