 of five hundred & twenty six pounds and six pence
 in money of the Province aforesaid conditioned for the day
 of the said hundred & sixty two pounds like good &
 lawful money on or before the fourth day of June
 next to be in the hands of our said one thousand
 seven hundred & thirty three as in & by the said obligation
 being hereunto had more at large appears
Now Know all of the said Jacob Woolford for
 securing the Payment of the aforesaid sum of two
 hundred & sixty pounds according to the condition
 of the herein before made Obligation that he hath granted
 bargained & sold unto the said Open Market deliver
 & by these Presents doth grant Bargain & sell
 & in Plain & open Market deliver unto the aforesaid
 James St. John Esq those three slaves following (that
 is to say) two Negroe Women named Sarah & Eliza & one
 Indian woman named Phillis **To have & to be**
 the said three slaves together with their Issues & Inheritances
 unto the said James St. John Esq his heirs & assigns
 forever. And the said Jacob Woolford for
 himself his heirs & assigns the said three slaves free
 & Inheritances to the said James St. John his heirs
 & assigns against all manner of Persons
 whatsoever shall & will Warrent & forever Defend

Provided nevertheless
 that the said Jacob Woolford shall & will pay unto the said
 James St. John the sum of one hundred & twenty six pounds
 on or before the fourth day of June next which shall be in the hands of our
 said one thousand seven hundred & thirty three according
 to the herein before made Obligation that then the said
 Jacob Woolford shall & will make satisfaction unto the said
 James St. John in all his debts & demands whatsoever and things herein
 contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding
 in Witness whereof the said Jacob Woolford hath hereunto
 set his hand & seal the fourth day of June 1733
 Attest: That the above Instrument was

Memorandum that on the 12 day of June 1733
 before me Charles Hill Esq one of his Majesty's Justices
 appeared to keep the Peace in Beaufort County personally

 women & Indian woman before written to the said James St.
 John Esq: & that he saw the said Jacob Woolford
 deliver the same unto the said James St. John Esq: &

Daniel Greene his Executors Administrators or Assigns
the said Sum of Five hundred Dollars & upwards Mon
of lawful Interest for the same on or before the
Day of January for the Redemption of the said ten
Bargained & sold then the present will be void
