Biz of Sale by James Ringon to W^r Smith

I^t NOW all men by these presents That I James
Ringon of the Province of South Carolina Esquire
for and in Consideration of the sum of Thirty Pounds
and Ten Shillings Current money of the said Province
to me in hand paid by William Smith of Charles Town
in the said Province Planter, the Receipt Whereof
I do hereby acknowledge and thereof and of every part
and parcel thereof do acquit Exonrate and discharge
the said William Smith his heirs Exec^t and assigns
for ever & I HAVE bargained sold Set over & delivered
and by these Presents in plain & open Market audience
to the last and default of Law in that I doth make
& provide Do Bargain Sell Set over & deliver unto
the said William Smith One bright Bay horse named
Spring about 8 his ten hands high mark'd D with
C on the form of a bush on the mounting shoulder
and H on the nearer buttock which said Horse was
Sometime since bought from William Harris of the
Province and the knife to hang and to stab ther^e
Horse and knife to be left with William Smith his exec^t
and assigns forever and I the said James
Ringon do hereby warrant grant and agree
to and with the D^r W^r Smith his exec^t and Assigns
that the above sold horse and knife & him or
them as his and his wife claim of all and every
person whom ever they may encounter and Adversary
at law and will Warrant and forever defend by
these presents In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and Seal this 12th day of
May in the fifth year of the reign of our Sovereign
Lord George the Second King of Great Britain
France

Marriage Indenture made the 8th day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand
Seven hundred and Thirty One and in the fifth year of the
reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Second by the
Grace of God of Great Britain France and Ireland King
Defender of the faith &c Between the husband
James Smith of Will Town in the Province of South
Carolina aforesaid Planter of the one Part and the
Trustees William Livingston and James Cochran of
Collington County in the Province of South Carolina a
foresaid Planters of the other Part Witnesseth
that the said James Smith for and in Consideration of
a Marriage already had & solemnized by & between Mary
his Wife a late maiden and now Mary Cochran
Da^r of Hugh Cochran late of the Province aforesaid
Deed and for & in Consideration of the Marriage so solemnized
Witnesseth James Smith received with the said
Mary Cochran now Mary Smith, and also for the
Consideration of their natural Love and Affection
which he the said James Smith hath & beareth
towards the said Mary for the Consideration of
the Sum of ten Shillings current money of the Province
aforesaid to him in hand paid by the said William Livingston
& James Cochran at & before the sealing & Delivery of
these Presents The Receipt whereof the said James
Smith doth hereby acknowledge to the said
James Smith doth hereby for himself his heirs
& Assigns Covenant Promise & Grant to and
With the said William Livingston & James Cochran
and their heirs & assigns that they the said Livingston
& James Cochran & their heirs & assigns forever
