Know all men by these Presents That John Arnold of Berkeley Town in the Province of South Carolina Planter for and consideration of the sum of One Hundred & forty five Pounds current money of the said Province to me in hand paid at and before the selling & delivery hereof by Griffith Rice of the Province aforesaid Perisago man the Receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge & my self to be thereunto fully satisfied Have Bargained sold & delivered And by these Presents in plain & open Market according to our form of Law due fully & absolutely Bargain sold alien assign & deliver unto the said Griffith Rice One moiety or half part of a Perisago and also One half part of all the Tackling Masts Sails Grapling & Grapling Rope Cans & other furniture & materials belonging to the said Perisago To have and to hold the said Moiety or half part of the said Perisago

And also One half part of all the sails Masts Rigging  
 Grappling Ropes Cords & Tackling belonging thereto under  
 the aforesaid Griffiths due his Executors Executors & Assigns  
 as his & their own proper Goods & Chattels to his & their own  
 use & behoof forever, And I the said John Arnold for my  
 self my heirs Executors the said half part of the Benings  
 with the tackle & promises unto the aforesaid Griffiths due  
 his Executors Executors & Assigns against all persons shall  
 come & demand & forever defend to make good the said Ben-  
 gamed Promises against the Claim of any person or persons  
 free & clear of & from all manner of former Gifts & Grants  
 forfeitures Claim & demands of or to the same by any way

Warrant to Divide the Estates of John Bollough

By the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Arthur Middleton Esq<sup>r</sup> Presid<sup>t</sup>  
 & Commander in Chief in & over his Majesty's Pro-  
 vince of South Carolina & Ordinary of the same

To Mr. John Murrell Mr. John Benson Mr. Henry  
 Lewis Mr. Charles Lewis & Mr. Jonathan Whelden

Whereas Samuel Bullock of this Province Planter  
 hath by his Petition this day to me set forth that a book

Seven years since John Bollough late of Christ Church Parish  
 Parish in this Province died Intestate leaving Martha Bollough  
 his Widow and two Daughters Elizabeth & Martha Bollough  
 That the said John Bollough was at the time of his Death possessed  
 of a personal Estate consisting of Negroes Household Goods Cattle &  
 other such, And also of a certain Tract of Land near the head of  
 Wando River in this Province containing some hundred Acres  
 or thereabouts

That the said Martha Bollough afterwards Intermarried  
 with John Murrell the Administration of the Estate of the said John  
 Bollough was on the fourteenth day of August 1728 Granted to them  
 the said John Murrell, & Martha his Wife who are now Called &  
 the same That the Petitioner being since married to  
 the said Elizabeth one of the Daughters of the said John Bollough

It was therefore Prayed That I should Grant an Or. or  
 to Divide the Estate of the said John Bollough the Intestate according  
 to the Statute in that behalf made & provided, And that the Petitioner  
 may have such Share allotted to him as he is intitled unto in  
 Right of his said Wife

I therefore Respecting Special Trust & Confidence in you  
 the said John Murrell, John Benson Henry Lewis Charles Lewis  
 & Jonathan Whelden Do hereby authorize you or any three or four  
 of you to View appraise & value the said Estate & Divide all the Estate  
 & Effects of the said Bollough dead in such manner as the said Peti-  
 tioner desired, And that the Petitioner may have such Share allotted to  
 him as he may be intitled unto in Right of his said Wife And you  
 Doings herein you are to cause to be certified under your hands or  
 any three or four of you And the same to be presented, annexed  
 to me Return at the General Chamber in Charleston On or before  
 the first day of January next for my Information or Disallowance  
 as to Justice shall appertain And according to Law in this behalf  
 made & provided
