you by the said Executors, or any of them, and there view
and appraise all and every the said goods: being first sworn
on the holy Evangelists of Almighty God to make a full and
perfect Inventory and Appraisalment, and to cause the same
to be returned under your hands or any three or four of you, into
the Secretary's Office in Cha^r Town, in order to be recorded on
or before the first day of May next ensuing.

Esq. do make this my Last Will & Testament in
an manner following.

Imprimis I make and constitute my eldest
Son Thomas Donning now in Great Britain
full & sole Executor of this my Will, and during
my said Son's absence from this Province until his
Arrival here, I appoint Thomas Wareing of
Berkeley County Esq. to be Executor of this my will.
I then Give and devise unto my said Son Thomas
and to his heirs & assigns forever all and singular
my Lands, Plantations, Tenements, Negroes, Slaves
and other my real & personal Estate

whatsoever

With my power and Whosoever, upon Condition
provided nevertheless, that my said Son Thomas
or his heirs do and shall within One year
after my decease, pay unto each & every of my other
Children, his brothers & sister, the sum of five hundred
Pounds a piece of good & Lawfull money of Great
Britain, and I do hereby Subject & Charge my
said real and personal Estate to & with the payment
thereof. I do hereby revoke all former & other Wills
by me at any time heretofore made, And I do publish
to declare this to be and stands as, and for my Last
Will & Testament. In witness whereof, I
have hereto set my Hand & Seal this 28th day
of September in the year of our Lord One thousand
Seven hundred & thirty One.
