 to the sum of five hundred pounds current money of the  
 said unto the said Charles H. Hodges his Esq; attorney or  
 signee to be paid payment to be truly to be made  
 to him by myself in due Execution in my  
 hands forthfoorth sealed with my seal dated the  
 twenty eighth day of October anno domini 1732

The condition of present Obligation is such  
 that the above named John Hodges his  
 Esq; or attorney of him shall be bound and may  
 be caused to pay unto the said Charles H. Hodges

Ets<sup>t</sup> Bonds at foyre H. o' clock and half sum of  
 Twenty hours and fourds weight of Clean Money  
 of the said Merchantable Bonds on the Day  
 of Charles Town or before the fifteyn the  
 day of March which will be in the year of our  
 Lord One thousand seven hundred and twenty four  
 without fraud known or further delay. Then this  
 Obligation to bind & have effect or otherwise  
 remain in full force & virtue John Hodges  
 signed Sealed & Delivered  
 in the presence of  
 Robert Abbott  
 Willm Cattell Junr.

 of the peace for Berkly County personally
