In the Name of God Amen John Hutchinson of Charles Towne Gent being of Sound and disposing Mind (Blessed be God) Do make my last Will as followeth First I Commend my Soul into the Hands of God Almighty Hoping thro' the Merits of my Dear Saviour Jesus Christ to have full pardon of all my Sins and to inherit Eternal Life My Body I Commit to the Earth to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Dear Friends and as for my worldly Estate I Dispose thereof as followeth I Give that all my Just Debt and Funeral Expenses be Paid and Discharged I Give and Devise unto my loving wife Charlotte Hutchinson and her Assigns for and during the term of her Natural Life One third Part of all that mine House and Furniture wherein I now dwell and of the several Storehouses Hutcheson and the Office behind and also the back Yard there to belonging butting and bounding to the Northward on another being my House or Furniture there to lying adjacent to Trustees for the Use of my loving Daughter Anne Hutchinson Item I Give and Devise unto my loving Son John Hutchinson and to his Heirs all that my aforesaid House my House or Furniture with the several Storehouses the Kitchen Office and back Yard there to belonging butting and bounding as aforesaid I Give and Devise unto my said Son John my said Daughter Anne the Sons Thomas and Joseph and my loving Daughter Elizabeth their Executors and Assigns all and every my Estate

Goods Debts Sum and Sum of Money and other Personal Estate of what
or Quality I have Equally to be Divided between them Share and Share alike
I will also in Case my said wife be Deceased or a Child at the time of my Death
and said Child be born alive together Male or Female that then said Child
have an Equal Share of all my Personal Estate with my said wife Child or
children as aforesaid I Do hereby will Authorize Direct and Impower my Exors
and Exors herein after named or either of them and the Exors of the Survivors
them to Purchase Sell and Dispose of all and singular my several Plantations
Garden Tenements and House Tenements whatsoever within the several Parishes
of Saint Thomas and Saint Dennis, of Christ Church or either of them or within
Part of Bacon County And I will and Direct that the Money arising by such Sale
Applied by such Exors or Exors Disposing and selling the same for and towards
paying and Discharging my Debts I Do hereby will and Appoint my said Exors
and Exors of Saint Thomas from time to time and Exors of the said last
and Testament and Appoint my said wife Guardian of my several Children aforesaid
till the respective Arrival of my Sons to the age of 21 and twenty years or more
and of my Daughters to the age of Eighteen years or Marriage which shall first
happen And I hereby Direct that what is herein given Divided or Bequeathed
to my said wife is by me so given to her in full of all Dowry Dues or other Part
or Part which she shall or may Claim Challenge or Demand of in to or out of
Part of my Estate Real or Personal by any Law Usage or Customs whatsoever.
Lastly I Do hereby revoke all former and other Wills by me at any time heretofore
made and Do Publish and Declare this to be and Stand as and for my last Will and
Testament The Witnesses whereof I have to this my last Will and Testament come
of this and the two preceding sheets of paper to my Hand and Seal the
Day of October in the Year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and twenty eight
My will also I and I hereby Give to my said wife all my Household Furniture

 Lords proprietors Deputies whose Names are therein subscribed bearing Date the Fifth
 Day of May in the Year of Our Lord Our House was then Hundred and four Will Give
 and Grant unto John Carter a certain Plantation Containing two Hundred Acres of Land
