Lawrence Mackay

Whereas James Symonds deceased was a good and law-
ful citizen of the Province of South Carolina
having whilst he lived at the time of his death diverse
goods rights & credits within the Province aforesaid by
means whereof the full disposition & power of granting the said
James Symonds deceased and also auditing the accounts & calculation
and reckonings of the said Administration and a final division
of the same to me is manifestly known & knowing that
the goods rights & credits of the said deceased may be well and
truly administered & recovered and a power of do hereby
grant unto the said Lawrence Mackay (in whose fidelity
his behalf I very much confide) full power by the tenor of
these presents to administer the goods rights & credits of the
deceased which to him in his lifetime & at the time of his
death did & do belong And to ask collect & recover & receive the
same & to pay the debts in which the deceased stood engaged
to full & forth as the said goods rights & credits will & may
according to their rate & order of law being first sworn
in the Holy Evangelists of it in my right hand to make a true
faithful & correct return thereof & to certify the same to the
Secretary of the Province in Charleston in order to be recorded on
or before the first day of December next ensuing & to
render a just & true account & calculation & reckonings of the
Administration thereof unto me or my certain Deputies &
to constitute you the said Lawrence Mackay as more of all &
singular the goods rights & credits of the said deceased.

I know all men by these presents that I John De la Mothe
of Northay County in the Province of Maryland am Heir &
heirly bound unto John Hargston of the same place
the full Just Sum of three hundred pounds Sterling money
of Great Brittain to be paid to the said John Hargston his
Existant Attorney Here Now ad more as it shal to which I
paymont well & ready to be made I bind myself my heirs &
Exors & assigns finally by these presents & sealed with my Seal
dated the thirty first day of January Anno domini 1716.

The Condition of this obligation is such, that if the above
bounden Archibald Hamilton shall well & truly pay or cause to
be paid to the said John & Carleton (as to any other Person or Persons
under the hand & Seal of Bridget now wife to the said Archibald
Hamilton lately widow to Patrick Roche of the County & Province
aforesaid appointed to receive the same) the Sum of one hundred
fifteen Pounds like Sterling Money in the Currency of the Province
is to be paid to Matthew Roche the eldest Roche Son of John Roche & Anne
Roche Children of the said Patrick Roche & the said Bridget & now
living in Ireland or to any one or more of the said Children or to
any other person or persons according to the discretion of the survivor
of the said Bridget & shall also permit the said Bridget to make &
execute a Letter of attorney under her hand & Seal to the said John
& Carleton or to any other Person or Persons at any time when
he shall think fit to receive & one hundred & fifteen pounds like Sterling
to dispose of the same according to her
discretion to any one or more of the said Children or to any other person
or persons as he shall think fit & also if the said Archibald Hamilton
shall permit the said Bridget by her last will & testament to dispose
of the said Sum of one hundred & fifteen pounds (provided she
doth not dispose of the same during her life unto her said Children
or to any one or more of them or to any other person or persons as she
shall think proper without any lawful hindrance or molestation
whatsoever a living other Person or Persons without authority given
by the said Bridget doth not dispose of the said one hundred &
fifteen pounds during her life nor by her last Will & testament
if then the said Archibald Hamilton shall well & truly pay
or cause to be paid the said Sum of one hundred and fifteen
pounds to the said John & Carleton for the joint use of the
