Know all Men by these Presents that Whereas I Abraham Sanders of Berkeley County in the Province of South Carolina Planter by my Obligation bearing date as soon written to be paid to Robert Taylor Hugh Butler and Daniel Ravenel of the said Province Planter in the full sum of Above hundred twenty eight pounds being of the Province aforesaid Bonds for the payment of five hundred eighty eight pounds the said Money to be paid the first day of February next ensuing the date hereof particular in the form of One thousand and seven hundred and twenty nine and by the said Obligation and Bonds doth more at large appear. Therefore for the better securing the said sum of Five hundred eighty eight pounds to be paid according to the condition of the said Obligation and for and in Consideration of the sum of two hundred and twenty nine and by the said Robert Taylor, Hugh Butler, and Daniel Ravenel before the sealing and delivery of these presents the said Robert Taylor, Hugh Butler, and Daniel Ravenel have bargained sold and delivered and do hereby present in plain and open Market do bargain sold and deliver unto the said Robert Taylor, Hugh Butler, and Daniel Ravenel Three Negro Men named Harry, Tim and Bear and one Negro Woman named Hannah To have and to hold to the said Robert Taylor, Hugh Butler, and Daniel Ravenel and their Assigns for ever Provided always and upon this Condition upon these things that if the said Abraham Sanders my heirs or Assigns do not and truly pay or Cause to be paid unto the said Robert Taylor, Hugh Butler, and Daniel Ravenel or either of them their or either of their heirs or Assigns the said sum of five hundred eighty eight pounds Current Money of this Province within six months from the date of the said Obligation according to the substance and meaning of the before provided Obligation and Bonds then these presents shall be utterly void and of no effect Or else shall stand in full force and virtue in Witness whereof I the said Abraham Sanders have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty eighth day of June One thousand seven hundred and twenty nine.
