Know all men by these presents That John Wilson of Colleton County in the Province of South Carolina Condition am to him and jointly or to his heirs and assigns to Stephen Ford of Colleton County in the Province aforesaid Rent in the full and Just Sum of Five hundred and Twenty Pounds Current money of South Carolina to be paid to him the said Stephen Ford his heirs Executors or Assigns to the Which Payment Well and truly to be made and done by do his day and my day my heirs heirs and assigns jointly by these Presents sealed with my Seal and dated the 15th Day of December Anno Dom 1731 The Condition of this aforesaid Obligation is Such that if the above bounden John Wilson his heirs Executors or Assigns do well and truly Content and Pay unto the above named Stephen Ford his heirs Executors or Assigns the full and Just Sum of Two hundred and Sixty pounds Current money aforesaid upon the first day of March next ensuing the date hereof Without fault or further Delay then this Obligation to be void and of none Effect or else to be remain in full force and Virtue

Know all men by these Presents That John Wilson of Colleton County in the Province of South Carolina Condition am to him and jointly or to his heirs and assigns to Stephen Ford of Colleton County in the Province aforesaid Rent in the full and Just Sum of Five hundred and Twenty Pounds Current money of South Carolina Conditioned for the payment of Five hundred and Sixty Pounds like Current money upon the first day of March next ensuing as by the said recorded Obligation and Condition both at large appear due for the better securing the said Sum of Two hundred and Sixty pounds Current money aforesaid the said John Wilson Do hereby make over bargain sell and Deliver and in plain and open Market according to the Just and due form of Law have bargained sold sold over and delivered unto the said Stephen Ford and to his heirs and Assigns forever Two Negroes by Name Dick and Nimble to have and to hold the said Two Negroes Boys unto the said Stephen Ford his heirs Executors and Assigns forever more Provided nevertheless that if the said John Wilson my heirs Executors or Assigns do well and truly Content and pay unto the said Stephen Ford his heirs Executors or Assigns the said Sum of Two hundred and Sixty pounds Current money as aforesaid upon the said first day of March next ensuing according to the true Intent and meaning of the said recorded Obligation and Condition for redemption of the above said bargained Sum then this Bill of Sale and every thing therein mentioned and contained to be utterly void and of none Effect otherwise to be remain in full force and Virtue In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 15th day of Decr Anno Dom 1731

The Last Will of Joseph Sealy Esq 537

In the Name of God Amen I Joseph Sealy of
Colleton County in South Carolina Pastor of the
in being of person and in sound memory for as the God
Dominate this my Last Will and Testament in manner
following that is to say I Principally from my own will
to give and gave it my body to the earth to be decently buried
and was fully satisfied of my debts and personal Charges
are satisfied and paid. It is pose as followeth
I hereby give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife
Three negroes named Will, Daphne and Charles a name
Anne Sealy and all the goods I had with her at my last
Will to her own disposal and the goods of my house
Land that I now live on during her Natural Life or till she
and give my son Joseph Sealy the use of the pasture he is going
to keep the fowls in repair to fallow him Beef
from I give and bequeath unto my only son Joseph Sealy
one Tract of Land on the Neck where he has been
lived and where he has been for ever and the two
hundred and twenty acres where I now live after
the death of my Loving Wife

From I give and bequeath unto the Minister of Easter Island
in the North of the said Island and the said Minister has been
paid for ever, which is in the hands of the said Minister and for
the years of the Lease that I had from the said Minister
in Joseph he paying Twenty pounds a year to the Minister
of Easter Island for the said Term of time which is paid
in the said Lease and then there was two hundred pounds to be paid
into the Treasurers of the Church a becom anchored to be put into
safe hands that the Interest may be paid for ever for the use

From I give unto my Daughter Sarah Cuthbert five pounds
when demanded

From I give to my Daughter Hannah Thre score ten pounds
when demanded

From my Will that the rest of my Estate which is yet un-
disposed of be equally Divided amongst my Children and Grand
Children hereafter mentioned my own son Joseph Sealy
and my daughter Elizabeth Britton and my son Rachael Britton
and my Grandson Joseph Andrew and my Granddaughter Mary
Andrew to be put in the hands of their father Joseph Andrew
for my Grand Children above mentioned

From I do now constitute and appoint my only son
Joseph Sealy and my friend Charles Odingswell to be Executors
of this my Last Will and Testament revoking all former Wills
by me made In Witness Whereof I the said Joseph Sealy
the Testator have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Eighteenth
day of January 1792
