

Letter of administration to John Machintosh granted to Andrew Allen & Charles Hill

By his Excellency Robert Johnson Esq. Gov. Genl. of the Province of the Carolinas & Ordinary of the same

To Andrew Allen & Charles Hill of Charles Town Merch.

Whereas John Machintosh of Winyaw Plantor deceased lately died intestate having whilst he lived and at the time of his death diverse goods rights and credits within the Province of the Carolinas by means whereof the full disposition & power of granting the admision of all & singular the goods rights & credits of the said John Machintosh decd & also auditing the accounts Calculations & reckonings of the said admision & a final Dismissal of the same to me is manifestly known to belong Deming that the goods rights & credits of the said decd may be well & truly administered converted & disposed of To him by grant unto the said Andrew Allen & Charles Hill (in whose stead in this behalfe I very much confide) full power by the tenour of these presents to administer the goods rights & credits of the said decd which to him in his life time & at the time of his death did belong and to ask & receive of all persons & receive the Claims & to pay the debts in which the said decd stood & to do so far forth as the said goods rights & credits will extend according to their rate & order of law being first sworn on the holy Evangelists of almighty God to make a true & perfect inventory thereof to be kept at the same as the Secretarys office in Charles Town in order to be recorded on or before the first day of December nexte now next ensuing And to render And to render a just & true account Calculation & reckoning of the said admision when thereunto required And to do aise Depute a Constitute by the said Andrew Allen & Charles Hill admors of all & singular the goods rights & credits of the said decd, In the execution

Administrators of the goods & credits of John Machintosh late of Winyaw Plantor deceased and wherever any of the goods of the said deceased are or remain within the said parts & places which shall be shown to you by the said Andrew Allen Charles Hill or either of them & there you are to appraise all papers, the said goods being first sworn on the holy Evangelists of almighty God to make a full & perfect inventory & appraisment of the same the same to be taken in your hands or any three or four of you into the Secretarys Office in Charles Town in order to be recorded on or before the first day of December nexte now next ensuing

 to appraise the Goods and Chattels of John
 McMichaels late of Whynas in the Province
 of North Carolina and were sworn on the
 holy Evangelist of Almighty God to make a
 true and just full Inventory and appraisement
 of all such Goods of the said deceased as should be
 owed to him by Andrew Allen & Charles
 & to Merbanks

In the Name of God Amen
 The thirtieth day of August 1738 I William Fuller
 of St Andrews Parish in the Province of South
 Carolina being Sick and weak in body but of Sound and
 dispoising mind and memory and calling to mind the
 uncertainty of this Life and knowing I am appointed for
 for all men to die do make, give and bequeath this my Last Will
 and Testament That is to say for me, partly word partly
 partly written my Soul to the hands of those that
 gave it and for my body I commend it to the Earth
 to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner
 at the direction of my Executors and as touching such
 worldly Estate whereunto it hath pleased God
 to bless me in this Life I give devise and dispose of
 the Same in the following manner and form
 I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth
 my beloved Wife the use of Three hundred pounds
 Current money of this Province to be paid to her One year
 after my decease by my Executors hereafter named with
 Thirty pounds per annum Current money as aforesaid
 during her natural Life, & to be paid her out of my Estate
 by my Executors also I give the use of my Negroes White
 Black Belly together with, the use of five good field Slaves
 Such as my Executors shall think fit to my Wife Elizabeth
 during her natural Life I also give and bequeath unto my
 Wife Elizabeth One feather bed and furniture with such
 Kitchen furniture as shall be thought fit by my Executors
 and the aforesaid Three hundred pounds Thirty pounds
 per annum The use of five Slaves, Bed and furniture and
 I give and bequeath unto my Wife in lieu of
