

Box 19 State of South Carolina March the 24th 1843 - In the name
No. 12 of God, Amen, - I, John O'Neill of Charleston, neck in the State
aforesaid being now of sound mind and memory but Sick of body and
impressed with the uncertainty of life, do make and declare this, to be my
last will and Testament revoking all other Wills and testaments heretofore
made. In the first place I desire that after my decease that my body
be decently interred and then that all my lawful debts together with my
funeral expenses be paid. - In the second place I will and bequeath
to my Sister Catharine O'Neill Spinster all my portion of the Lot and
house situated and lying in Society Street in the City of Charleston, I also
give and bequeath to her Two hundred and Fifty dollars and ~~and~~ also the
Negro Slave by name Puffy together with her increase, But should my
my Sister Catharine O'Neill die without issue I will and desire that
all the aforesaid property real and personal return to my heirs. In the
third place I give and bequeath to my Sister Mrs Ann Beatty all my por-
-tion of the house and lot situated and lying in black bird ally in the City
of Charleston during her life time and then to be given to her son James
Beatty and his heirs forever. In the fourth place I give and Bequeath as
a legacy to my Sister Mrs Mary Severin the sum of five hundred Dollars
to be paid by my ~~my~~ Executors. In the fifth place I will and bequeath to
my dear wife Mrs Margaret J O'Neill and to all my beloved Children now
or hereafter the whole residue of my estate both real and personal that I now
have or hereafter may have from whom soever or whencesoever it may be,
In the Sixth place I will and desire that my dear aged daughter

to be paid by my ~~very~~ Executors. In the fifth place I will and bequeath to
my dear wife Mrs. Margaret J. O'Neill and to all my beloved children now
or hereafter the whole residue of my estate both real and personal that I now
have or hereafter may have from whom soever or wheresoever it may be, —
In the Sixth place I will and desire that my dear aged father Edmond
O'Neill Senior be decently supported during life and when dead to be buried in
a becoming manner from the income of my estate either real or personal, and
and in the Seventh place, I will and desire that my Executors hereafter
mentioned understand that all the property either real or personal whether
mentioned by deed or by writing or any agreement whatsoever whether
purchased in my name John O'Neill or in the name of my Brother Patrick
O'Neill is to be of Equal Value between us divided share and share alike, and
in this they are to understand that the house in which my Brother Patrick O'Neill
now lives situated lying and being on Cannonborough or Cannon^{Back} ^{Charleston} Neck if
the Tithes be not drawn in his name as well as in mine I will and Bequeath
to him one ~~half~~ half of the same house and lot above mentioned together
with half the lot lying and being on the South side of Cannonstreet Charleston
Neck, but my Executors will please remember that there is one Negro Slave
purchased formerly by Mr. Gatis for my son John James O'Neill and that
this negro, notwithstanding that the Bill of Sale may be in my name and
in the name of my Brother Patrick is the Exclusive right entirely of my Son
John James O'Neill — and that, this my last will and testament be pro-
perly executed I constitute and appoint Patrick O'Neill my Brother

Thomas Gates and the Rev. P. O'Neill as my lawful Executors of this my last Will and Testament who may sell or dispose of the same my Estate as to them proper for the good of my heirs Estate &c. In witness whereof I place this my Signature or hand and Seal in the presence of us as witnesses.

Codicil in I, John O'Neill of Charleston neck State of South Carolina do desire my Executors already mentioned, namely Patrick O'Neill my Brother Thomas Gates and the Rev. P. O'Neill to take notice in this Codicil that I will and Bequeath to Patrick Keegan the sum of Two hundred dollars in Cash to be paid out of my Estate also I desire them to remember the Two following items first that my Brother Edmond O'Neill does not owe me any money whatsoever even should they find notes instruments or acknowledgments to that effect. Only I desire that all monies due to the firm of John and Patrick O'Neill and whatever monies due of it be received & paid out after my decease as from the firm and to it until my estate is settled. In witness whereof I place this my hand and Seal in the presence of us as witnesses.
