uncertain and being desirous to arrange my worldly affairs on such
a manner as that in the event of death my Will relative thereto should
be fully expressed and carried into effect by my Executor and
Trustee Hereinafter named Do hereby Make declare and publish
this writing as and for my last Will and Testament. I then after
supplicating the Almighty for Pardon of my sins it is my will
that my body be interred in one of the Catholic burial grounds
should I die in this City (Charleston) I then It is my Will
that my just debts should I owe any thing at my death be fully
paid by my Executor as soon after my decease as possible. I then
Give and Bequeath to my House Keeper Martha Cleveland and in
case of her death to her daughters Catherine and Jane, or the survivor
of either of them all my furniture and all moneys due me by Mr.
Jonathan Lucas (in whose service I now am) or any other persons
as a mark of my affection for them. I then I hereby nominate
constitute and appoint my friend Charles Kanapaux Trustee
and Executor of this my last Will and Testament requesting him
to take charge of my Estate as soon as possible after my decease to
pay my debts and Legacies as herein directed And to take upon
him the execution of my Will. In Witness Hereof I have set
my hand and seal this 19th day of March 1841

that my just debts should I owe any thing at my death be fully
paid by my Executor as soon after my decease as possible. Item
I give and bequeath to my House Keeper Martha Cleveland and in
case of her death to her daughters Catherine and Jane, or the survivor
of either of them all my furniture and all moneys due me by Mr.
Jonathan Lucas (in whose service I now am) or any other persons
as a mark of my affection for them. Item I hereby nominate
constitute and appoint my friend Charles Kanapaux Trustee
and Executor of this my last Will and Testament requesting him
to take charge of my Estate as soon as possible after my decease to
pay my debts and legacies as herein directed And to take upon
him the execution of my Will. In Witness hereof I have set
my hand and seal this seventh day of September in the year of
our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and thirty six and in the
Sixteenth year of the Independence of the United States of America.
