Letter of Attorney from Mr. Richard Wright to Richard
Hutcheson and Richard Woodward

Whereas I Richard Wright of James Island
in the Province of South Carolina am duly appointed
Administrator to All the goods and Chattels Defts &
Credits of my late beloved brother John Wright
of Charles Town Merchant deceased and am also
appointed Guardian & Curator of Eleanor and Elizabeth
Wright being Infants and Coheirs of the said John
Wright Be it Therefore known
unto all men that I the said Richard Wright Administrator
and Guardian as aforesaid do hereby make Constitutions
Ordain my Trusty and well beloved friends Mr. Richard
Hutcheson and Mr. Richard Woodward both of
Charles Town my true and Lawfull Attorneys jointly and
either of them severally for me and for the use of the said
Administration in me vested to Levy recover and receive
all and singular the debts dues and Demands which
were due owing or by any right becoming to my said brother
John alive or to his Estate under his deceased and I do
I do power my said Attorneys or either of them to sue
implead or prosecute any of the persons indebted to the
said Estate as the said Attorneys or either of them shall
think meet & convenient to be done I do give full power to my
said Attorneys jointly and severally to give acquittances
and discharges for any sum or sums of money which
they or either of them shall receive for the use of the said
Estate And such receipts and discharges shall
be as full and effectual as if signed and given by
me in person And I do further authorize and
empower my said Attorneys or either of them

To Oversee and Govern, all the Lands and Townships
Which belong to my said brother and also to oversee
and manage all the Servants, Slaves and other affairs
to the said Estate appertaining in such wise and
manner as they my said Attorneys shall think meet
and convenient. Giving and Granting
unto my said Attorneys my full power & authority to
do & Execute all and singular the premises as aforesaid
and Effectually as if done or Executed by me in person.
