with my funeral expences, shall (as soon after my decease as a decent and
respectful period may allow) in the first place out of my my Real
or personal Estate and Effects be fully paid and satisfied. Item I give
devise and bequeath to my two Dear Sisters viz: Sarah Becklin Purvis &
Mary Bacon Wyatt the whole of my Real and personal Estate, to be di-
vided, and each of them to share and share alike, and all the claims of
Legacies and Bequests that may be bequeathed to me. And lastly

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I do nominate and hereby appoint Robert Leiby as my Executor & Sarah Becklin Rivers as Executrix of the State aforesaid, for carrying into effect the provisions of this my last Will and Testament, empowering them with full power and authority for so doing.
