 To Have and To hold the s^d Bargain p^rmisses unto the s^d
 James Watt His Ex^{rs} Administrators and Assigns to the only
 proper Use and behoof of the said James Watt his Ex^{rs} Adm^{rs}
 and Assigns for ever and we the said Joseph and Margrett
 Danford for our selves & Ex^{rs} Adm^{rs} & Assigns the s^d Bargain
 Promise unto the s^d James Watt his Ex^{rs} Adm^{rs} & Assigns
 Against All Persons shall and will Warrant and for
 Defend by these Presents and it is hereby covenanted &
 Agreed by and between the s^d Parties In Witness
 whereof wee the s^d Joseph and Margret Danford have

In the Name of God Amen Sarah Parker of Beekly County in the
 Province of South Carolina Widow being of Sound and Perfect Mind and Memory prais
 becom to Almighty God for the same, but Considering the Uncertainty of Death and
 the uncertainty of the time thereof do make and Ordaine this my last will and Testament
 in manner and form following.

First I bequeath my soul into the Hands of Almighty God Hoping and Aspiring
 believing the Salvation of the same thro the alone Merits of Jesus Christ my Sola
 Saviour and Redeemer And my Body I Comitt to the Earth to be decently Buried at the
 Discretion of my next of kin or Friends being in full and Constant hope of a
 Resurrection unto Eternal Life And for my Estate to which I have been God to bestow
 upon me in this World do Give and Dispose of the same as followeth.

Imprimis I Will that all my Just Debts and Funeral Expences shall be first paid and Discharged.
 Item I Give devise and bequeath unto my Son John Parker of the said Beekly County in the
 said Province of South Carolina Planter, and to his Heirs and Assigns for ever All my
 Land in the Province of South Carolina belonging or paying to my said Son of Land in
 the said Province between his Settlement and his Deeds Lands and all my P^rsonal and
 sayning on that and lying East and South from the same with all the Houses Tenements and
 Buildings on the said Lands or any of them standing and being or to be and or any part
 thereof Belonging and Appertaining And all the Lands Tenements and Hereditaments
 whatsoever that I shall dye possessed of in the said Province of South Carolina or elsewhere
 or that I shall have any Right Title Interest or Claim to at the time of my Death To have
 and to hold the said Lands Tenements Hereditaments and all other the Premises with
