The Last Will of Joseph Sealy Esq

In the Name of God Amen I Joseph Sealy of Guilford County in North Carolina Pastor of the Baptist Church in Guilford County in North Carolina do hereby certify that the within and last aforesaid will of the said Joseph Sealy was duly proved and the same was read and the same was found to be the last will and testament of the said Joseph Sealy and the same was approved by the said Court and the same was ordered to be recorded and the same was so recorded and the same is now on file in the office of the said Clerk of the Court.

I have given unto the Minister of said Island in the Baptist Church or Deputy called Ann Baptist two hundred pounds for ever which is in the hands of the said Minister and I give the year of the lease that I had from the said Minister unto my son Joseph the paying twenty pounds a year to the Minister of said Island for the whole term of time which is specified in the said lease and then the said two hundred pounds to be paid into the Treasurers of the Church a bookman to be put into safe hands that the Interest may be paid for ever for the use a book mentioned.

I have given unto my daughter Sarah Cook five pounds when demanded

I have given to my daughter Hannah Threese ten pounds when demanded

I have given my Will that the rest of my Estate which is yet undisposed of be equally divided amongst my Children and Grand Children hereafter mentioned my own son Joseph Sealy and my daughter Elizabeth Britton and my son Rachael Britton and my Grandson Joseph Andrew and my Granddaughter Mary Andrew to be put in the hands of their father Joseph Andrew for my Grand Children above mentioned.

I have given constituted and appointed my only son Joseph Sealy and my friend Charles Dingwell to be Executors of this my Last Will and Testament revoking all former Wills by me made In Witness Whereof I the said Joseph Sealy the Testator have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighteenth day of January 1792

was in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and
thirty One the last Will and Testament of Joseph
Sealy late of this Province deceased was proved approved
allowed if the said deceased having whilst he lived and
at the time of his death reserved goods rights and credits
within the Province of South Carolina by means whereof the
approbation and allowing of his Testament in the power
of granting the approbation of all and singular the goods
rights and Credits of the said Deceased to me is manifestly known
to belong and that the admission of all & singular the goods
rights and Credits of the said Deceased and his Testament
any manner of conveyance was granted and committed
unto Joseph Sealy his son and Charles Dingsell named
Executors

God with and faithfully to administer and make a
full and perfect inventory of all and singular the
goods rights and Credits of the said Deceased and to exhibit the

 Eight, James Buchanan together with their Tails, Coat, Gravel, Cables & all Tackle
 and Appurtenances belonging; To have & to hold the said bargained Premises unto
 the said Richard Hill, his Heirs, Executors, Assigns for ever; the said
 Lewis Hendricks his Executors & Administrators the said bargained Premises
 unto the said Rich^d Hill his Heirs, Executors, Assigns against all Persons
 shall & will Lawful and forever Defend by this present; Provided nevertheless
 that if the said Lewis Hendricks his Heirs, Executors, Assigns do well
 truly pay or have to be paid unto the said Rich^d Hill his Heirs, Executors, Assigns
 the said Sum of one hundred & ninety Eight Pounds on the twenty fourth
 Day of December which will be in the year four thousand seven hundred
 & twenty five, according to the true Intent & Meaning of the above Recited
 Obligation & Condition, for Redemption of the above said bargained Premises
 then this Present bill of Sale to be void & of No Effect in Law & remain in
 full force & Virtue. In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand & Seal the twenty first Day of June in the year of our
 Lord one thousand seven hundred & thirty One.
