Touraine the 11th April 1760 - and residing at Charleston being of sound
mind have made the following Testamentary disposition to wit - 1st I give
and bequeath to my daughter Augustine Fillette all that is in my Chamber ex-
-cept my wardrobe, of which I have made a present to my Grand daughter Emeline
Fillette 2nd I give and bequeath to my daughter Augustine Fillette the sum
of four hundred dollars which I have already paid over to her 3rd I have plac-
-ed in charge of Francis Dupont a gold repeater watch, with chain and key
of gold of the value of Two hundred and fifty Dollars. Besides a repeater watch that
cost me One hundred and fifty dollars - A third watch of the value of one hun-
-dred dollars - 4th I have paid for him at two different times after his shipwreck
two hundred dollars - Besides a Bill of exchange which he drew on me at Was-
-pau (Providence) to the amount of One hundred dollars - 5th Paid for him
to Mr. Le Seigneur, besides the costs made by the Lawyer whom he employed the
sum of Seventy five Dollars - 6th I nominate Mr. John Alexander Esq^r for
my testamentary executor - 7th I conscientiously declare that I owe nothing to
any person, in any way whatever - 8th I revoke and annul every other will
and Codicil that I may have made prior to this day - Done at Charleston

206 (South Carolina) at my residence King Street the day month and year above, in
presence of three witnesses according to the formalities required by the Law of this country.
In testimony of which I have signed the present Will written by another hand
with the three witnesses required. (Signed) S Dupont

Box 14 The State of South Carolina — In the name of God, Amen,
No. 12 I, Martha Jenkins of Stono, St Pauls Parish, State aforesaid, do make,
publish, and declare this to be my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking
all former Wills by me made. In the first place, I direct, that all my
just debts be paid as soon after my decease as possible. As I lately gave to my
son Benjamin James Jenkins eight hundred and sixty five dollars, which
I inherited from the Estate of Thomas D. Bell, it is my desire, in order that
my children may be placed on the same footing, that my daughter Sarah
Bailey Jenkins shall have and receive as her portion of my Estate, in the
manner hereafter to be mentioned, eight hundred and sixty five dollars
more than my said son Benjamin. It is my Will, that my daughter
Sarah Bailey Jenkins shall be empowered, and I hereby authorize her, to
take and hold, at the sum of eight hundred and sixty five dollars less than
the appraised value, should she desire to possess it, and plantation on it.
