No. 50 In the Name of God Amen I Joseph Hix of the town of Charlotte in the county of Mecklenburg in the State of North Carolina, being in full health, & being admonished by my pains and suffering of the uncertainty of life and anticipating that the period of my death is not distant; and being of sound and disposing mind and memory, blessed be God for the same, do ordain this to be my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking, and annulling and declaring void all former

will and wills by me at any time heretofore made or made. It is my Will, that my body after my death, be removed to Rehoboth my native place and there interred. It is my Will that my Executors hereinafter named shall in their discretion convert all my property into money or other evidences of personal Estate & that they pay all my just debts as soon as it is practicable for them so to do. And Whereas I some years since gave freedom to a negro woman, who was then my slave and ^{who} was commonly called Mary Wilson, and whereas I am desirous to protect her from want, I hereby direct my Executors hereinafter named to invest the sum of Five hundred Dollars in Stocks or in ~~Bank~~ bond & mortgage or otherwise, as they may see fit and to apply the income thereof for her support when the same may become necessary in the judgement of my said Executors and in such sums and at such times as they may see fit. And after the death of the said negro woman it is my will that the said sum of Five hundred Dollars be paid to and retained by my friend Edward H. Bippell & I hereby give and bequeath the said sum of Five hundred Dollars to the said Edward H. Bippell as a token of my friendship and regard for him. It is my Will that my Executors sell all my real Estate and I hereby empower, authorize & direct my said Executors and the survivor of them, and either of them who shall be qualified as such Executor to sell such real estate at such time or times, in such portion or portions, either at public or private sale, and on such terms as they shall see fit and deem best; and to give good and valid deed or deeds for the same to the ^{purchasers or} purchasers thereof. After the payment of my debts and all the charges and expenses which may be lawfully incurred in the execution of this my last Will and Testament, then it is my will that the proceeds of my estate be equally divided among my said friends.
