 appear by the said my Last Will & Testament, I do hereby declare, I will and
 bequeath all my Estate & Effects real or Personal what I have or
 shall be Entitled unto of what kind soever unto my Wife Eleanor
 Morrison, unto my son William Morrison & to my Daughter Eleanor Morris
 all there now in the Kingdom of Ireland, the said Estate or Estates real
 or Personal after the payment of my Just Debts & funerals Expenses
 to be Divided between my Wife & Free Children, In Equal Shares & if
 it should happen that any one of them should be Dead before the
 making of this my Last Will & Testament, I appoint this my Intention
 that there be an Equal Division between the Surviving, & if there
 be but one of three now Living, it is my Will that the said I shall Indent
 all, whether Wife or Child, I constitute to appoint my Wife Eleanor Morrison
 my whole & sole Executrix to this my Last Will & Testament; but for
 the advantage of my Wife & Children, I do constitute & appoint
 Henry, Sheriff & James Fisher my Executors until such Time as my
 Wife shall come Over or appoint some Person at her own Election, I do
 July 24th 1732. Charles Town South Carolina in the Queen of Great
 Britain Lord George, by the presence of God of good Remission as
 signing my hand & Seal

 Wherewith I the said Lewis Hendricks am held and firmly bound unto Richd. Hill of
 Charles Town in the Province aforesaid Merchant for the full sum of three hundred
 and ninety six Pounds Current Money of South Carolina, Conditioned for the payment
 of one hundred & twenty eight Pounds Current Money of the Province aforesaid On
 the Twenty fourth day of December which will be in the Year of our Lord
 one thousand Seven hundred & thirty two as by the said Bond Obligation and
 Condition doth more at large appear, for the better securing the said sum of one

and by this presents, in Due form of Law,
 To bargain, Sell & Deliver unto the said Rich^d Hill his Heirs, Executors and Assigns
 one Negro Man named Prince, & one (Slave) called Pettigauger Squares from back
 Eight, James Buchanan together with their Tails, Coat, Gravel, Cables & all Tackle
 and Appurtenances belonging; To have & to hold the said bargained Promises unto
 the said Richard Hill, his Heirs, Executors, Assigns for ever; the said
 Lewis Hendricks his Executors & Administrators the said bargained Promises
 unto the said Rich^d Hill his Heirs, Executors, Assigns against all Persons
 shall & will Warrant and forever Defend by this presents, Provided nevertheless
 that if the said Lewis Hendricks it is his Executors, Assigns do well
 truly pay or have to be paid unto the said Rich^d Hill his Heirs, Executors, Assigns
 the said Sum of one hundred & ninety Eight Pounds on the twenty fourth
 Day of December which will be in the year four thousand seven hundred
 & twenty five, according to the true Intent & Meaning of the above Recited
 Obligation & Condition, for Redemption of the above said bargained Promises
 then this Present bill of Sale to be void & of No Effect in Law & remain in
 full force & Virtue. In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand & Seal the twenty first Day of June in the year of our
 Lord one thousand seven hundred & thirty One.
