

Montage by Lewis Paterson to William Catlett

This Indenture made the second day of March in the fifth year of our Sovereign Lord George the Second by the grace of God of Great Britain House and Ireland King Defender of the faith Anno Domini 1731 Between Lewis Paterson of Charleston in the province of South Carolina Planter or man of the One part and William Catlett Esq. of the Province aforesaid Merchant of the other part Witnesseth that whereas the aforesaid Lewis Paterson by his Bond or Obligation bearing date with these presents became and stands bound unto the aforesaid William Catlett Esq. and his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns in the penal sum of One hundred pounds sterling for the payment of One hundred pounds current money of the said province of South Carolina We know ye that the said Lewis Paterson for the further securing the payment of the aforesaid Bond unto the said William Catlett Esq. and his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns for the consideration of the sum of five hundred pounds current money of the said province aforesaid to be paid and for divers other good and sufficient causes hereunto moving have bargained sold assigned transferred and let over And by these presents have again sold assigned transferred and let over all my right title interest benefit property and demand whatsoever unto the following household goods viz two beds and two bedsteads One leather Table Eight Chairs two Iron Stoves two bookshelves two big Chests and two small ones One small Chest of Drawers two Dozens of plates and six Dishes four blankets five pillows

And two bolsters One tea Kettle One Sauce pan and six dozen bottles unto the said William Catlett Esq. his heirs and assigns forever To have and to hold the aforesaid goods and Chattels unto the said William Catlett Esq. his heirs and assigns and to his and their own proper use and behoof for ever provided always and it is the true Intent and meaning of this present Indenture by the parties aforesaid that if the said Lewis Paterson do pay or cannot be paid and discharged unto the said William Catlett Esq. his heirs or assigns two aforesaid bond or Obligation for One hundred pounds current money of the said province aforesaid at or within the time limited by the said bond or Obligation then this present Indenture shall be in full power force and Effect In Witness whereof I the said Lewis Paterson have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and year first aforesaid Signed Sealed and Delivered Lewis Paterson and shewy being first had of a tea Kettle in part for the whole in presence of us
