such legacies as are hereinafter mentioned. Item, I give to my
said Son all sums of Money that I now have or may hereafter
entitled to from any source whatever, also any Bank or other stock
which I now have, or may hereafter have. Item, I make my
said Son my residuary legatee. It is my wish and desire that
my worthy daughter in law and my beloved Grand Children
should receive some token of my love and affection for them.
It is therefore my will and desire that Eliza C. Bryan receive out
of my Library Mr. Hanks life and the aged Christian Cabinet. Eliza
L. Mulledge to receive my Old Family Bible, and Newtons Works. Lydia
B. Segare to receive my Silver Case marked L. B. and Miniatures of Pious
Women - Mary S. Bryan to receive my formerly new Bedstead & Mattress
Saddles, &c. Segare Bryan to receive my Drawers with the Desk to it

State of South Carolina: I, Ann Waring of the State aforesaid being of sound mind, do make, and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others. 1st It is my Will, and I desire that all my just debts shall be paid, 2nd I give to my nephew Thomas R. Waring Three Hundred Dollars. 3rd I give to my nephew Morton A. Waring, his Bond drawn payable to me, and dated 7th day of March 1831, Conditioned for the payment of Seven Hundred Dollars, to him and his heirs forever. 4th I give to my niece Rebecca B. Waring (the Daughter of M. A. Waring, one Hundred dollars. 5th I give to M. A. Waring, Seven Shares Standing in my Name in the Books of the State Bank, the dividends arising from which, to be paid by him, semiannually to my faithful Servant Old Betty during her natural life. 6th I give to my niece Susan J. Wayne the Sum of Three Hundred Dollars; and my female Slave named Betty, to her & her heirs forever. 7th I give to my niece Mary B. Wilson, one Hundred Dollars. 8th I give, devise and bequeath all the rest, residue and remainder of my Estate real & personal
