all the said rest residue and remainder of my Estate Real and
Personal unto the lawfully begotten issue of my said Grandson living
at the time of his death, to the said issue and his heirs or their heirs

after the death of my said Grandson then I give & devise & bequeath
all the said real residue and remainder of my Estate Real and
Personal unto the lawfully begotten issue of my said Grandson living
