Box 11 State of South Carolina. In the name of God, Amen, I, Marianna
No. 14 Chisolm being of sound mind do make this my last Will and Testament.
I, give unto my daughter Harriet P. Horlbeck my servant Girl, Pester, and
all my plate and household furniture. I give unto my daughter, Georgianna
P. Chisolm, my servant girl, Julian, with power on the part of my Executor to
sell said slave, and invest proceeds, for the benefit of said Georgianna, should
it be thought proper. I also give unto my daughter Georgianna, all my bed
room furniture. I give unto Elias Horlbeck M.D. my slaves Clarissa and
Isaac, for his numerous attentions to me. I give unto William Chisolm Horl-
beck my Grand son, my slave Gundy, to be delivered to him, when he attains
the age of twenty one — hereby empowering my Executor, to sell said slave and
invest proceeds in stock or bonds, before that time, should my Executor think
proper. I also give unto my said Grand son William C. Horlbeck, Twelve
hundred Dollars to be invested in stock or bonds, and to be delivered him when
he attains of age. It is my will that said two legacies should be held by
my Executor, In Trust for the use of my Grand son William, and that the
annual profits shall be regularly invested, so that said legacies may accu-
mulate for the benefit of my said Grand son. Provided however, that

174 Executor, or, the Guardian of said William, may if it is thought proper, devote such annual profits, towards giving him a liberal education in I give unto my Executor, Seven hundred Dollars, In Trust to hold the same for the use of my Grand daughter, Charlotte P Worlbeck, to be appropriated in such manner as my Executor shall think proper, for the benefit of my said Grand daughter. I give and devise the residue of my property, after payment of my debts, to my two daughters, Harriet P Worlbeck and Georgianna P Chisolm, to be equally divided between them. It is my will and desire that the two legacies given to my daughter Georgianna P Chisolm shall be held by my Executor, In Trust for G. P. Chisolm, so that she may have the yearly profits arising therefrom, free from any control of any husband, she may hereafter have, or liability for his debts, In Trust, after the death of said Georgianna for her child or children; and in case she dies leaving no children; then in trust to my Grand Children, who may be living at her death. I hereby appoint Elias Worlbeck my Executor to this my last will, and empower him and his Executors, to do and perform all acts requisite to carry my intentions fully into effect - In witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal at Charleston this Twelfth day of March A.D. 1838.
