debts be paid by my Executor.

3.rd I leave to my dear Mother Martha Broen during her
natural life my servant girl Belia, together with the natural
increase of said girl, as also the small amount of money I have
now at Interest.

4.th I leave to my Mother as aforesaid and to my Brother
John Thomas Waring Broen, all my House hold furniture, china
and glass alike, to be sold or equally divided between them.

5.th I leave my watch to Sarah Florina Baker, the daugh-
ter of my sister Sarah Ann Baker.

6.th I request that my servants Sally, Chloe and her child
Benjamin be sold by my Executor, the proceeds placed on Interest.

354 which interest is to be transmitted annually to Samuel B. Wilkins of Charleston South Carolina to be appropriated by him to the support of my Husband B. Wilkins during his natural life. After his death this interest is to be paid to my Mother Martha Brown during her natural life.

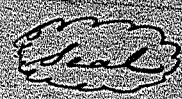
If After my Mother's death the whole of the property or dis-
posed of in this Will to her, or also that left for the support
of B. Wilkins is to be divided share and share alike between
my Sister Sarah Ann Coles and my Brother John T. W. Broer
and should either of them have no lawful issue at the time
of his or her death, then the property is to go to the survivor or
his or her heir or heirs.
