

Deed of Gift from Martha Parsons to her Daughter Mary

To all to whom these Presents shall Come I Martha Parsons of Charles Town in South Carolina in the Province of South Carolina Widow send Greeting
That whereas Martha Parsons for and in Consideration of the Natural Love and Affection which I have and bear unto my Daughter Margaret Parsons hath Given and granted unto my said Daughter Margaret the full Right Power or parcel of Land containing Fifty Seven Acres and a half situated lying and being on Ashley River in the Province aforesaid adjoining to and of Capt Edmund Bollinger, one part of Mr Charles's land one part of Mr Elizabeth Clay, and one part of Mr Thomas Rivers, with all and every the Appurtenances belonging or appertaining to the said Land in the said Province (in Case the said Land should happen to be Disposed of) and also one Feather Bed with all and every the Furniture thereunto belonging and two good Quins and two large Spread Bets One for Spoon and one large Spoon Marred on the back so in value. My said Eighty pound in Cash and also all my wearing apparel To Have and to Hold all and singular the above said and things unto the said Margaret Parsons her Heirs Executors Administrators Assigns (from and Indefinitely after my decease) for ever To the only proper and absolute Use and behoof of the said Margaret Parsons her Heirs Executors Administrators Assigns for evermore In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this Eighth Day of November Anno Domini 1729 And in the third Year of his Majesty King George the Third
