Martin Holt & Edward Hull of Charles Town
in the County of Berkeley and in the Province of
South Carolina Bricklayers & Joiners are held &
firmly bound unto Joseph Hunt of Berkeley County
Carpenter in The Sum of Two hundred Twenty &
three Pounds Six Shillings & eight Pence Current
Lawfull money of this Province to be paid to the
said Joseph Hunt or to his certain Attorneys Executors
Admors or Assigns to the Which payment We
truly to be made we do bind our selves our heirs
Executors & Administrators & every of them jointly
by these Presents Sealed with our Seal & dated
this Ninth day of January in the fifth year
of the reign our Sovereign Lord George the
Second by the Grace of God King of Great Britain
France & England Defender of the faith Anno Domini
1727

The Condition of this Obligation is Such that
if the Abunders Martin Holt & Edward Hull or either
of them their or either of their heirs Executors or Admors
do well & truly Pay or cause to be paid to Joseph
Hunt or to his heirs Executors Admors or Assigns

The Just & full Sum of Two hundred & twenty
Pounds thirteen Shillings & four Pence of Like
money aforesaid in three months from the date
hereof next ensuing then this Obligation to be
Null & void else to remain in full force & Virtue
