

77th No: 47 The State of South Carolina - Whereas I, Mary Ann Green, of the City of Charleston in the State aforesaid, widow, having made and duly executed my last Will and Testament in writing bearing date the day of in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty five, & on I do hereby declare this present writing to be as a Codicil to my said Will, and direct the same to be annexed thereto, and taken as part thereof - Whereas by the Laws of the State emancipation is prohibited, but in consideration of the long and faithful services of Beck, I am desirous that she and her family, namely, James, Emma, Matilda and Susan, should be placed in as comfortable a situation as possible, it is my will and desire, and I do hereby order and direct, that after the decease of my beloved Mother, my Executor named in my said Will, shall and will permit, them and each of them, to work out, and not demand any wages from them, or either of them, but suffer and permit them to appropriate the same to their own support and the promotion of their own convenience - But if it should hereafter be considered that this my intention is inconsistent with the Spirit of the Laws, and cannot therefore with propriety be effected then it is my will that after the decease of my dear Mother, the said Beck and her said family together with their future issue and increase, shall belong to Ann Findlay Query to be secured to her in the same manner as the other property bequeathed to her, subject to the same limitations; this family to be however under her immediate and exclusive control, as from circumstances, she is the person who can most fully appreciate my feelings and will further my intentions as far as practicable - In witness whereof I the said Mary Ann Greene have to this Codicil set my hand and seal the twenty fourth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty five.

 sell and Dispose of the same either at private or public Sale, and on such
 Terms & Conditions as he may approve -; and to Vest the Proceeds arising
 therefrom in such manner as to him may seem proper - I Give devise &
 Bequeath unto my Son Benjamin John Smith, all and every Part of the
 Real Estate of which I am now in possession, as well as any other Landed Property
 to which I may hereafter have any Right, Title, Claim or Interest: To him, his
