I Mary Ann Gyles of the City of London, in the Kingdom of England, at present residing in the City of Charleston, in the State of South Carolina, being weak in body, but of sound sense and memory, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all Wills by me

310 heretofore at any time or place made.

First. I desire that my Executor shall pay all my just debts & funeral expenses.

Second. I give and bequeath to my son Charles Gyles, one hundred pounds Sterling in trust, to appropriate the interest of the same toward the maintenance and education of his niece Sarah Ann Nightingale daughter of William Nightingale, untill she shall have married or attained the age of twenty one years. And when she the said Sarah Ann Nightingale, shall have attained the age of twenty one years, or shall have married, it is my will and I desire that the trust shall determine and end, and the principal be paid over to her. And in case of the death of the said Sarah Ann Nightingale before marriage or her arrival at the age of twenty one years, I give the said sum of one hundred pounds Sterling to be divided equally between my son Charles and William Gyles.

Second. I give to Mary Richards Gyles the sum of fifty pounds Sterling.

Third. I give all the rest and residue of my Estate to my sons Charles and William Gyles equally to be divided between them. The children of a deceased Brother to take the share to which the Father would have been entitled. And I do hereby constitute and appoint Charles Gyles, William Gyles and John A Gyles Executors of this my last Will and Testament. Given under my hand and Seal this Eleventh day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and thirty seven and in the
