N^o 19 I Mary Hill, of the City of Charleston in the State of South Carolina, do hereby
revoking all others, make this my last Will and Testament Inprimis
I will and direct that my funeral expences and all my other just
debts be fully paid and discharged immediately after my Death
Item I will that all the Stock in trade which I may die ^{possessed} of
be delivered (by my Executors hereinafter named) to Susan Warstead to
be sold by her in the course of six months, and I direct that during
that time that she shall be allowed the use of the Store and the House
now by her occupied free from all charges and expences whatsoever for
the said use and occupation. Item I will and bequeath a portion
of all my Books, Household and Kitchen furniture, and wearing
apparel, unto Susan Warstead, to her and her heirs forever, and the
residue of the said Books, Household and Kitchen furniture & wearing
apparel, I give to the said Susan Warstead, to be by her distributed
among my Friends and Servants according to my directions
particularly mentioned in my written Memorandum left in
her possession. Item I give and bequeath unto Edward ^{Dew} ~~xxxx~~ Junior
Physician of London in the Kingdom of Great Britain, two Hundred
Pounds sterling now held in charge for me by his Father Edward
Dew Esquire of the Custom House in the said City and Kingdom
aforesaid. But should the said Edward Dew Junior die previous
to his being entitled to receive this said Legacy. Then I will & bequeath
the said Two Hundred Pounds sterling to Sarah Dew and Mary Dew

Law Esquire of the Custom House in the said City and Kingdom
aforesaid. But should the said Edward Daw Junior die previous
to his being entitled to receive this said Legacy. Then I will & bequeath
the said Two Hundred Pounds (belonging to Sarah Daw and Mary Daw
(the Daughters of the said Edward Daw Esquire) to them and their
heirs forever. Share and Share alike. Item I will and direct, that
all my real Estate Situate in King Street at the Corner of King and
Clifford Streets and in Clifford Street, be sold at Public Auction or
Private Sale in one two or three years by my Executors, on such terms
and conditions as they in the exercise of their best Judgments
will conceive to be most advantageous for the benefit of those
therein interested. Item I will and direct that the Negro Slaves
Lycias and Ann be sold, and I request my Executors that they
will in selling these Negroes use a kind and diligent caution
in obtaining for them humane owners. Item I will and direct
that from the proceeds arising from my said Personal Property
and real Estate hereinbefore directed to be sold that the following
Legacies be paid as soon as the Sales are effected and the said
Proceeds shall have been by my Executors collected. Viz^d—
I give and bequeath unto Sarah Margaret Daw Daughter of
Dyer Daw of the Custom House London England in the Kingdom
of Great Britain, Two Hundred Dollars to her and her heirs forever.
(England) I give and bequeath unto Thomas W. Adams of London
Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars to him and his heirs forever.
I give and bequeath unto Amelia Bullen of London (England)

(The Daughters of the said Edward Dew Esquire) to them and their
heirs forever. Share and Share alike. Item I will and direct, that
all my real Estate Situate in King Street at the Corner of King and
Clifford Streets and in Clifford Street, be sold at Public Auction or
Private Sale in one two or three years by my Executors, on such terms
and conditions as they in the exercise of their best Judgments
will conceive to be most advantageous for the benefit of those
Persons interested. Item I will and direct that the Negro Slaves
Lydia and Ann be sold, and I request my Executors that they
will in selling these Negroes use a kind and diligent caution
in obtaining for them humane owners. Item I will and Direct
that from the Proceeds arising from my said Personal Property
and real Estate hereinbefore directed to be sold that the following
Legacies be paid as soon as the Sales are effected and the said
Proceeds shall have been by my Executors collected. Viz^t—
I give and bequeath unto Sarah Margaret Dore Daughter of
Dyer Dore of the Custom House London England in the Kingdom
of Great Britain, Two Hundred Dollars to her and her heirs forever.
(England) I give and bequeath unto Thomas Will Adams of London
Two Hundred and fifty Dollars to him and his heirs forever.
I give and bequeath unto Amelia Butler of London (England)
Two Hundred and fifty Dollars to her and her heirs forever.
Item I give and bequeath unto my Executors, to them and theirs

kins one thousand dollars he must however life to be by them invested in the most safe and productive property and the interest thereon as it shall become due shall be regularly paid over to Susan Harstede (her own receipt alone being taken for the same payments) during her life time and after her death the same shall arising from this paid one thousand dollars, shall be paid to her Daughter Caroline Elizabeth Service until she attains the age of twenty one years, and if she shall attain that age then the whole amount shall be paid over to her the said Caroline Elizabeth Service to her and her heirs forever freed from all ~~all~~ debts and obligations whatsoever. But should the said Caroline Elizabeth Service die before attaining the age of twenty one years then I give and bequeath the said one thousand dollars to the said Sarah Jew and Mary Jew (daughters of the said Edward Jew Esquire) to be equally divided between them, to them and their heirs forever. And I give and bequeath unto Emma Stanley the wife of Robert Stanley now residing in the State of Alabama Two hundred and fifty Dollars to her and her heirs forever. Also I give and bequeath unto George O'Scale the Daughter of James O'Scale residing in Charleston in the said State Two hundred Dollars and fifty Dollars to her and her heirs forever. And I give and bequeath unto Eliza Woffman now residing with me one hundred Dollars to her and her heirs forever. Also I give and bequeath unto Mary Williamson Fifty Dollars to her and her heirs forever. Also I will and direct that my said

now or lately residing in Augusta (Georgia) one hundred and
fifty Dollars to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath
unto Paul Garisch now or very recently residing in New York
one hundred and fifty Dollars to him and his heirs forever.
Item I give and bequeath the just and residue of my personal
property and the proceeds arising from my real estate, not herein
before disposed of, to Sarah Dew and Mary Dew (the daughters
of the said Edward Dew Esquire) to be equally divided between
them share and share alike to them and their heirs forever.
And Lastly I nominate and appoint William A. Caldwell
Esquire and John Phillips Executors of this my said Last Will
and Testament. In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this the Twentieth day of June in the Year of
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three and
in the fifty sixth year of the Sovereignty and Independence of the
