Letter of Attorney to Archibald Macdowell granted to his Widow

By the Hon^{ble} Arthur Middleton Esq^r President and
Commander in Chief in and over his Majesty's Province of
South Carolina and Ordinary of the same.

To Mary Macdowell Widow

Whereas Archibald Macdowell late of the Parish of Saint Andrew in this Province
deceased lately by his last Will and Testament bequeathed unto his Widow
certain Rights and Credits within the Province aforesaid by word and order of the full
Court and power of granting the demand of all and singular the said Rights and
Credits of the said Archibald Macdowell deceased and also the said Archibald Macdowell
deceased and Acknowledging of the said demand and a full Discharge of the same to the
said Mary Macdowell his Widow in full Discharge of the said Rights and Credits of the said
deceased may be well and truly Administered Lawfully and Discreetly and lawfully Grant
unto the said Mary Macdowell (in whose Fidelity in this behalf I am much assured) —
the Power by the Force of these Presents to Administer the said Rights and Credits of
the said deceased which to him in his last Will and Testament bequeathed and at the time of his death did belong
unto the said Mary Macdowell his Widow and her Heirs and assigns forever to pay the said Rights and Credits
the said deceased's good Debts and Legacies for the said Rights and Credits will —
according to their rate and Order of Law being first sworn on the Holy Evangelists
of Almighty God to make a true and perfect Inventory thereof and to exhibit the same
into the Secretary's Office in Charles Towne in Order to be provided on or before the first
Day of May now next ensuing and to render a just and true Account thereof and
of the said Administration when thereunto required and for the said Mary Macdowell
and for the said Mary Macdowell Administering of all and singular the
said Rights and Credits of the said deceased
