In the name of God Amen: I Mary Caldwell of the City of Charleston in the State aforesaid being sick and weak in Body but of sound Memory and understanding and considering the certainty of death, and to the end I may be the better prepared to leave this world, whenever it shall please God to call me hence, Do therefore make and declare this my last Will and Testament in words following that is to say: First, I will and devise that all my just debts and funeral expences be paid off by my Executors hereinafter named, so soon as may be practicable. Secondly, I will ~~and~~ devise and bequeath the whole of my estate, consisting of the following Real and Personal Property (to wit: in and

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lots of land situate in Stotts Alley, in the City of Charleston adjoining each
other but which were formerly but one lot, one negro woman named Susan
one other negro woman named Hannah, household and kitchen furniture and
wearing apparel) unto Captain Thomas Davis and Samuel J. Wagner, In Trust
nevertheless to and for the following purposes, that is to say, that they the said
Captain Thomas Davis and Samuel J. Wagner Trustees as aforesaid shall suf-
fer and permit M^{rs} Mary E. Wilson the wife of John Wilson to have the full use
and enjoyment of my said Estate both Real and Personal as above enumerated
for and during the full and term of her natural life, freed and discharged
from the debts and control of her said husband John Wilson, in as full and am-
ple a manner as if she the said Mary E. Wilson were sole and unmarried, so
that the said John Wilson may not have any interest in my said Estate either
present or contingent or any authority, power or control over the Estate so as above
bequeathed by me to the said Mary E. Wilson: But if the said M^{rs} Mary E.
Wilson should at any time desire to sell, convey or dispose of any part of my said
Estate, it is my will and desire that the said Trustees do permit her to do so, pro-
vided she do settle on the said Trustees property of equal value with that dispo-
sed of by her, to be held by them to the uses declared in this Testament: Thirdly
Upon the death of the said Mary E. Wilson, it is my will and desire that all my
Estate before enumerated shall be equally divided among all of my Grand chil-
dren, who may be alive at the time of M^{rs} Wilson's death: but in case of the death
of any Grand child, such grand child leaving children, who shall survive the
said M^{rs} Wilson, then such children of such grand child, shall take among them
per capita the same share that their parent would have taken if alive. Lastly:

Estate before enumerated shall be equally divided among all of my grand children, who may be alive at the time of Mr Wilsons death: but in case of the death of any grand child, such grand child leaving children, who shall survive the said Mr Wilson, then such children of such grand child, shall take among them per capita the same share that their parent would have taken if alive. Lastly: I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my good friends Captain Thomas Davis and Samuel J. Wagner Executors of this my last Will and Testament making them Trustees also to the intent and for the purposes ~~hereunto~~ hereinbefore expressed, hereby revoking all Wills and Testaments by me ever made on any former occasion.
