Whereas Matthew Newborough late of this Province Deceased lately by his last will and testament having whilst he lived and at the time of his death Diverse Goods Rights and Credits within this Province assigned by means of the full Disposition and power of granting the Administration of all and singular the Goods Rights and Credits of the said Matthew Newborough Deceased and also the Auditing the Accounts Balances & Bookings of the said Deceased and a final Dismission of the same to us is Manifestly known to belong. Desiring that the Goods Rights & Credits of the said Deceased may be well & truly Administered Lowered and disposed of to good use by Grant unto the said Edward Stull (in whose Fidelity in this behalf I very much Confide) full power by the Force of these Presents to Administer the Goods Rights and Credits of the said Deceased which to him in his Lifetime and at the time of his Death did belong, and to Ask, Collect, receive, and receive the same and to pay the debts in which the said Deceased stood Obligated so far forth as the said Goods Rights & Credits will extend according to their rate and Order of due being first sworn on the holy Evangelists of Almighty God to make a true and perfect Inventory thereof and to exhibit the same into the Secretary's Office at Charles Towne in Order to be Recorded at or before the first Day of March now next Ensuing And to send a Just and true Acc't of the Balances & Bookings of the said Deceased within the time to require And so Ordained Deputes and Constitutes You the said Edward Stull Owner of all & singular the Goods Rights and Credits of the said Deceased.
