of Almighty God to make a true & perfect Inventory & appraisement
thereof & to cause the same to be recorded under your
or any three or four of you into the Secretarys Office in Charles
in order to be recorded on or before the first day of May next
ensuing

The Last Will and Testament of Nicholas Day

In the name of God Amen I Nicholas
Day of Charles Town being Enlisted on an Expedition
against some Northern Indians now at Enmity with North Carolina
considering the uncertainty of this life I Declare, Orating
publish and Declare these presents to be and contain my last
Will and Testament Inprimis I Give Devise and
bequeath unto my Andros Allen of Charles Town in the said
Province of Carolina Merchant all and singular my
Estate real and personal in the said province with which I shall
be seised in any way belonging to me at the time of my decease or
anywise howsoever To have and To hold all and
singular my said Estate real and personal Whatsoever unto
the said Andros Allen his heirs Executors and Assigns for ever
Lastly I make nominate and appoint the said Andros
Allen and his Executors the sole and only Executors of this my last
Will and Testament here by revoking and annulling null and
void all former and other Wills by me heretofore made In wit-
ness thereof I the said Nicholas Day have hereunto set my
hand and Seal this 1st day of November
in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred & Eleven

be his last Will and Testament

necessary to be done in the premises for the recovery
of all or any such sum or sums of money debts dues
and demands aforesaid for and in my name, to do
and perform as fully largely and lawfully to all intents
and purposes as my self might and lawfully do if I was personally
present or as if the matter required more special
then is here particularly mentioned or given in
these presents Attorneys under them for the purpose
aforesaid to make and execute and again at
