Nicholas Duke, Merchant, belonging to the Majority, now  
the Happy under the command of the Hon<sup>t</sup>ble Capt<sup>t</sup> Lloyd now in  
the Province of South Carolina being very sick of body but of a sound  
and Disposing mind and memory thanks be to God, for it and calling to mind  
the Gravity and Uncertainty of this Mortal State Do ordain to make this  
be my Last Will and Testament & first and principally commanding my  
Soul into the Hands of Almighty God that gave it being for salvation & strength  
in the hands of mediation of Jesus Christ my only Lord and Saviour and my body  
I commit to the Earth to be decently Buried according to the Direction of my  
Executors herein after named and as to such worldly goods as I hath pleynly  
to Byle my Will to give and dispose of them in manner & form following  
I will that all my Just Debts and funeral Charges be paid soon after my  
Death.

give and Requieate unto my well beloved and Faithfull friend James  
Lawrence of Charles Town in the Province, arrested all my Estate & more  
Especially my wages which are Due to me for my Service on board the  
Happy now under the Command of the Hon<sup>t</sup>ble Captain Lloyd as  
arrested and I Do hereby nominate Constitute and Appoint my said Friend  
James Lawrence to be Sole Executor of this my Last Will & Testament  
Respecting all former Wills by me at any time heretofore made, and  
Declar<sup>r</sup>ing this alone to be and Contain my Last Will and Testament  
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the  
Sixth Day of August in the year of our Lord 1732.

of Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina Merchants in the sum of one thousand one hundred  
Pounds Current money & Whereas Mr. John Moore at the special instance Request and Desire of the  
John Arnall & Christopher Smith hath on the Day of the Date hereof Entered into one and an  
Obligation with them to the said John Moore to pay Wages Paul Jones Other debts to Mr. Lambell  
of the sum of four thousand and two hundred Pounds Current money with Interest thereon at the rate  
Written for Payment of the sum of One thousand one hundred Pounds Current money On the eleventh  
Day of March which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirty one  
and whereas the said John Arnall & Christopher Smith are Justly indebted unto  
and now actually Defid of divers Regress Moneys that is to say the sum of one thousand of two
