Know Ye that on the ~~third~~ ^{fourth} day of September
in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred &
thirty one the last will and testament of James McNabney
of Charleston in this Province deceased was proved & approved
of the said deceased having whilst he lived and at the
time of his death diverse goods rights and credits within the
Province aforesaid by means whereof the approbation and allowance
of his testament and the power of granting administration of
all & singular the goods rights & credits of the said deceased
to me is manifestly known to belong & that the administration
of all & singular the goods rights & credits of the said deceased
and his testament in any manner of way concerning was
committed to George Duval Andrew Allen & John Brown named
executors in his last will & testament being sworn on the
holy Evangelists of Almighty God well and faithfully to admin-
ister to make a full & perfect inventory of all & singular the
goods rights & credits of the said deceased and to exhibit the
same into the Secretaries office in Charleston in order to
be recorded on or before the first day of January
next ensuing & to render a just & true acct. calculated
& reckoning thereof when the same is required

Whereas Peter Wallis late of S. James Parishes in
this Province deceased lately died Intestate having whilst he lived

Hall by authority of the right Hon^{ble} the Lords Commissioners
of His Maj^{ties} Treasury and in pursuance of His Maj^{ties}
Commission under the great Seal of Great Britain to us in that
behalf Deputed and Empowered and Do hereby depu^{te} and impow^{er}
George Chalby to be Searcher of all the rates Duties and impositions
arising and growing due to his Majesty at Charles town in South
Carolina in America by virtue whereof he hath power to
enter into any ship Bottom Boat or other vessel as also into
any Shop House warehouse hothouse or other place whatsoever
to make diligent Search into any French Chest Pack Case Trunk
or any other parcel or package whatsoever for any goods wares or
merchandise prohibited to be imported or exported or whereof the Customs
or other Duties have not been duly paid and the same to Seize to his
Maj^{ties} Use and also to put in Execution all other the lawfull statutes
and authorities for the managing or Collecting the said Duties in
all things proceeding as the Law directs wholly paying and requiring
all & every his Maj^{ties} Officers and ministers & all others whom it
may Concern to be aiding and assisting to him the said Chalby in
all things as becometh Given under our hands & Seal at the
Customs house London the twenty fifth
day of June in the fifth year of the reign of our Sovereign
Lord King George the Second Anno Dom 1731
