hundred and Ninety pounds Current money of his Provin-
in full for three Negro Slaves I have sold to him the said John
Williamson. Viz One Negro Woman called Diana with
two Children of the said Diana called Winter and Aster
and that I will from time to time & at all times hereafter
afford and confirm the said Diana Winter and Aster
to the said John Williamson his heirs and assigns and do
hereby oblige my self my heirs Exors & assigns to the
performance of the said. In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this thirteenth day of November 1721
And in the Eighth year of our sovereign Lord George by the Grant
of His King of Great Britain &c. Phelo Peter. O

John Holton his Widow 61 198 2.2

By his Excellency Robert Johnson Esq. Captain
General Johnson's & Landing in Chief in

Miss Horton Widow

Whereas Thomas Holton late of this province Chamberlain
Deceased, being Deceased Intestate, having whilst he lived & at the
time of his death diverse goods rights & credits within the province
of Maryland by means whereof the full disposing power of grant-
ing the Administration of all & singular the goods rights & credits
of the said Deceased Thomas Holton, (and also auditing the true
Calculations & reckonings of the said Administration, and
a final Dismissal of the same to me is manifestly known
to belong & knowing that the goods rights & credits of the
said Deceased may be well & truly administered understood & disposed
of & hereby Grant unto the said Anne Holton, in whose
Fidelity in this behalf I very much confide) full power by
her & her or these presents to Administer the goods rights
& credits of the said Deceased which to him in his lifetime &
at the time of his Decease did belong: And to ask & receive
& receive the same & to pay the debts in which the Deceased
stood obliged so far forth as the said goods rights & credits will
extend according to the rules & orders of Law, being first shown
on the holy Evangelists of Almighty God to make a true &
perfect Inventory thereof to be exhibited & returned unto the
Secretarys Office in Charleston in order to be recorded on
or before the first day of May next ensuing and to
render a Just & true & full Calculations & reckoning of the said
Administration When thereunto required and also Obtain
L. p. uter & constitute you the said Anne Holton Admone-
y all & singular the goods rights & credits of the said Deceased
