N. 40 Baker of sound health and memory, do make and ordain this my
last Will and Testament in manner and form following.

I Bequeath to my son Richard Bohun Baker my plantation
on Ashley River named Archdale, the boundaries of which have
been accurately laid down in a Plat, made by Mr Joseph Purcell
in December 1791, to him, his heirs and assigns forever.

I Bequeath to my son Barnard Elliott Baker the tract of land
on New River I inherited from my kinsman Richard Pendarvis, of
which was restored to me by the Legislature of this State, to him, his heirs
and assigns forever: but as Mr Edward Newville has pretensions
to this land bequeathed to my son Barnard and the laws may de-
-cree it to him, notwithstanding my opinion of the right I have to it
and my son ^{Barnard} may lose it: then in this case in lieu of the land
above named I leave him the tract of land on Ashley River
lately belonging to my Brother William Bohun Baker, sold by
him and purchased by me from Doctor Air, which has been
accurately laid down in a Plat by Mr Purcell in November 1791
to him, his heirs and assigns forever. But should Mr Newville
not succeed in recovering the land on New River and my son
Barnard remain in quiet and perfect possession of it, then my

326 - ded between my Beloved Wife and my above named Children and share and share alike, and that my Wife be entitled to reside with my Daughter Mary Butler Baker in my house on Archdale during her widowhood and no longer and until the marriage of my Daughter Mary. Lastly my Will is that no Division of my property shall take place or be made until the payment of my Funeral Expenses and just debts and I appoint my sons Richard and Barnard Executors to this my last Will & Testament bearing date this 17th day of May in the year of our Lord 1810. & in the 34 year of American Independence.
