

Box 12 The State of South Carolina. In the name of God amen.
No 12 I, Richard Wall of Charleston in the State aforesaid being at present of sound
and disposing mind, memory and understanding, but on account of advanced age
of feeble body, and knowing that I must in the course of nature shortly leave this
terrestrial scene, Do make publish and declare this to be my last will and Testament.
In the first place I devise that all debts which I owe and my funeral expenses
be paid as soon after my decease as may be practicable. In the second place I
give and bequeath all claims which are or may be due me by the government of
the United States for prize money to which I was entitled as one of the crew of the
Bon Homme Richard and Alliance, Commanded by John Paul Jones in the
War of the Revolution to my Sons William Wall, Edward P Wall, Launcelot Frank-
lin Wall and their Mother Amelia Wall to be equally divided between them share
and share alike. The claim which I have against the government being for
prize money due me in my own right, and in right of my brother Gilbert Wall
whose only heir I am, and who was also one of the crew of the said Bon Homme
Richard and Alliance Commanded by J^r. Paul Jones aforesaid and also all
claim which I may have as one of the crew of the Bon Homme Richard, for prizes
which were carried into Denmark, and for which the Government of the United
States are now about to open a negotiation with Government of Denmark. —
both in my own right and in right of my brother Gilbert aforesaid. In the
third place I give devise and bequeath to my Sons Edward P Wall and Launcelot
Franklin Wall their heirs and assigns all the Lands to which I am entitled and
possessed of in the State of South Carolina being Two Hundred acres Granted to me
in right of my brother Gilbert, by the State of South Carolina, and situated in Beau-
fort District in the State aforesaid.

uated about the Natchez ^{on the} Mississippi River I give devise and bequeath to my afore-
said sons William Wall, Edward P. Wall, Launcelot Franklin Wall and
their Mother Amelia Wall to be equally divided between them share and share
alike to them and their heirs assigns forever — all the rest and residue of my
Estate of whatever nature and description, and wheresoever situated — I give devise
and bequeath to all of the aforesaid persons to be equally divided amongst them
share and share alike — And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my
~~this my last Will and Testament~~

three sons aforesaid Executors of this my last will and Testament, hereby publishing my last will by me heretofore at any time made - Witness my hand and seal this 2^d March 1842
