Richard Eggle's Will

In the name of God Amen the
21st day of April 1732 according to the Custom
of the Church of England I Richard Eggle of
South Carolina Brother to James Eggle of
the County of Wiltshire late Clerk of the Peace
of the said County Gent being of a perfect
Memory and Remembrance praised be God
made and Ordain this my last will & Testament
in manner and form following First I bequeath
my Soul into the hands of Almighty God my Maker
hoping that thro' the meritorious Death & passion
of Jesus Christ my only Saviour and Redeemer
to receive full pardon and forgiveness of all my
Sins and that as for my Body to be buried in
Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Ex-
ecutors the nominated Item I Give and Bequeath

unto the poor of the parish of Troon Sallwood
in the County of Somerset in England the Sum
of Seven hundred pounds current money of
Great Britain to be returned for the use of the
said poor of the aforesaid parish and County -
For ever that is to say the principal to be put
at Interest or to purchase a piece of Land which
the Officers of the said parish with the Consent
of the Ministers shall think most proper And
the Rents of the said Land or Interest of the said
Seven hundred pounds to be paid out yearly -
In Cash to be Distributed to the poor families
on the Eve of Christmas day or the Nativity
of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ forever
Item I Give and bequeath to Anna Poles
wife and Daughter to Christian Gull and
Elizabeth Timberlay the Sum of One hundred
pounds current money of Great Britain which
shall become due to her when the Rent due
of the Seven Hundred is committed to the poor of
the said parish to the Satisfaction of her Executor
and not otherwise The Bond to remain at
Interest until the full Sum given is raised in
Cash I Want and Do nominate & appoint my
 Loving friend Thomas Timberlay to be my sole
Executor of this my last will and Testament
revoking all other Wills and Testaments I
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and Seal this 22 day April 1732

Planter for and in consideration of Love Good
Will and Affection which I have and do bear
towards my Loving Son and Daughter
William and Margaret Little both of the same
Parish and County Planter and Spinster given
and granted and by these presents do freely
fully and absolutely give and grant unto
the said Will and Margaret Little their Heirs
Executors or assigns all and singular Two hundred
Acres of Land of y^e Plantation which I now live
upon one Negro man named to be my Son and
Calfs One Moore and Calfs now being in my
present possession in the Parish aforesaid.
Known by the name of Pon Pon of which
with these present I have delivered him and
for the said William and Margaret Little my
Inventory signed with my own Hand and
bearing even date to these and to hold all the
said two hundred Acres of Land and Negro man
and Cows and Calfs Moore and Calfs in the
said premises or at Dwelling house where to
them the said William and Margaret Little
their Heirs &c. Administrators from hence
forth as his and hers and their proper Land
Negro and Cattle Moore and Calfs absolutely
without any manner of Condition in Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my Hand
and Seal this 26 day of January in the fifth
