Mortgage by Robert Lister to Solomon Middleton
 South Carolina

To all to whom these presents shall come
 Robert Lister of the Province of South Carolina
 Shipwright sends Greeting Whereas Solomon Middleton
 of the Province aforesaid, has met in and by a certain
 Bond & Obligation bearing even date with these presents
 is become held and firmly bound jointly & severally together
 with the said Robert Lister, unto Benjamin Whitaker
 of the Province aforesaid Esq^r in the Sum of a penalty of
 Three hundred pounds Lawfull money of the Province
 aforesaid Conditioned for the true payment of One
 hundred and sixty five pounds on or before the second
 day of February next ensuing the date of these presents
 as in & by the said Bond or Obligation appears NOW
 KNOW YE that the said Robert Lister the better to
 secure the payment of the aforesaid One hundred &
 sixty five pounds, according to the Condition of the aforesaid
 obligation and to the intent and purpose that the said
 Solomon Middleton his heirs Executors and assigns may be
 well Defended & well compensated Indemnified from
 the aforesaid Obligation and for the Payment of the
 money thereby conditioned to be paid hath Granted
 Bargained and Sold and by these presents doth
 Grant Bargain & Sell unto the aforesaid Solomon
 Middleton his heirs Executors assigns commonly called or
 known by the name Dick & Jack To have and
 to hold the said two Negro men Slaves named Dick
 & Jack unto the said Solomon Middleton his Executors

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I do hereby assign forever, and the said Robert Liston
for himself his heirs Executors and Assigns with Guaranties
promise and Grant to and with the said Solomon
Middletown his heirs Executors and Assigns that it shall
& may be Law full to the said Solomon Middletown
his heirs Executors & Assigns lawfully & quietly to
have hold Occupy possess & enjoy the aforesaid negro
Slaves named Dutch & Jack without the lawful let
trouble hindrance or Interruption of any person
or persons whatsoever & that free & clear & fully &
clearly & so rated acquitted & discharged of and
from all former and other Gifts Grants bargains
& sales Mortgages Judgements Taxations and
Incumbrances whatsoever Provided nevertheless
that it be the true intent & meaning of these presents
and of the parties to the same that if the said Robert
Liston his heirs Executors or any or either of
them shall & do well and truly pay or cause to be paid
unto the aforesaid Benjamin Whitaker his heirs Executors
or Assigns the aforesaid sum of One hundred & thirty five
pounds On or before the aforesaid day of February next
ensuing the date of these presents according to the
Condition of the aforesaid Obligation, and so and
shall save defend keep harmless & Indemnify
the said Solomon Middletown his heirs Executors & Assigns
of and from all suits troubles Costs Charges
& expenses whatsoever Which they or either of them
shall or may be put unto for or by reason of the said
Obligation That then their present Grant bargains
& sales being in all or things herein contained shall
be utterly void to all intents and
purposes

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Propose Whatsoever any thing herein contained to the contrary
in anywise notwithstanding In Witness whereof the
said Robert Liston hath hereunto set his hand & Seal
the second day of February in the fifth year of the reign
of our Sovereign Lord King George the third Anno
Dom. 1731.
