To Robert Wright Esq

Whereas his most Sacred Majesty by his royal
 sign Manual bearing date the 10th day
 of November One thousand seven hundred and thirty
 In the fourth year of his reign hath been graciously
 pleased to require and authorize me forthwith to cause
 Letters patents to be made the seal of this his Majesty's
 province of South Carolina for constituting and appointing
 upon the said Robert Wright Chief Justice of and in this
 Majesty's said province To hold Esquire and enjoy the
 said Office during his Majesty's royal pleasure and
 your successors within the said province together with
 all and singular rights profits privileges and
 immunities

Encomendments unto the said places belonging or appertaining with full power and authority to hold the same in the Supreme Courts of Judicature at such places and times as the same may and ought to be holden within the said provinces And now know ye that in pursuance and Obedience to his majesties royal Commands I have Committed and appointed And by these presents do constitute and appoint you the said Robert Wright to be Chief Justice of and in this his Majesty's said provinces to hear and determine all pleas civil and Criminal happening and arising in and through the same according to the Laws and Statutes of Great Britain and the several Acts of Assembly in the provinces Giving and by these presents granting unto you the said Robert Wright full power and authority to hold the same in the said provinces at such places and times as the same may be ought to be holden within our said provinces And to do execute perform all other matters and things as to the Office of Chief Justice in this province doth belong Or as Justice of Oyer and Terminer Justice of Assize and Great Sessions may and ought to have to do and to perform according to the several Laws and Statutes of Great Britain and the Acts of Assembly in this province in that behalf made and provided To hold the said Office of Chief Justice during his Majesty's royal pleasure and your own discretion over and above the said provinces together with all and singular the rights profits privileges and Emoluments unto the said places or Office belonging or appertaining

South Carolina to him in hand at and before the sealing
and delivery of these presents well and truly paid by
Samuel Cobby of Charleston in the province of Georgia
Merchant the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge
have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain
and sell and deliver unto the said Samuel Cobby one
Negro man named Dufford unto the said Samuel
Cobby his heirs Executors Assigns and assigns to the
only proper use and behoof of the said Samuel Cobby
his heirs Executors Assigns and assigns for ever and the
said Robert Mear both for my self my heirs and assigns
the said Negro man and assigns unto the said Samuel
Cobby his heirs Executors Assigns and assigns as the
persons shall and lawfully warrant and for ever of
